Vivian Rd. development

Decision delayed on plan

STOUFFVILLE — Residents from the Vivian Rd. and 9th line area are continuing to bring pressure against council in opposition to a proposed residential subdivision.

Representatives appeared before Planning Board last week, before council two weeks ago, and one resident who attended the planning meeting indicated he would appear as a delegation at a future meeting.

Chairman Eldred King told Mr. Dowson he had been asked to present the report verbally so interested residents, who were in attendance, could hear the information. There were about a dozen neighbors present.

At Mr. King's urging Mr. Dowson outlined several different methods that could be employed to keep planning controls on the property if it were sold by the developer.

Mr. Dowson seemed puzzled as to why he had been called to read the report as it had been received by council the week previous.

He said he thought the residents complaints premature as there is no mention of density in the application for an Official Plan amendment.

"These issues would be more appropriately dealt with at the zoning or subdivision level," he maintained.

Chairman Eldred King told Mr. Dowson he had been asked to present the report verbally so interested residents, who were in attendance, could hear the information. There were about a dozen neighbors present.

At Mr. King's urging Mr. Dowson outlined several different methods that could be employed to keep planning controls on the property if it were sold by the developer.

Mr. Macdonald called it a "speculative venture" and he charged that there is vagueness in the developer's plans.

A small hamlet would be formed he said and he estimated there could be 50 children in the subdivision which might require an addition to the Ballantrae school and would consequently raise taxes.

He claimed that information in the technical report that said the water supply is adequate was obtained by rule of thumb.

Mr. Dowson admitted there has been no drilling on the site but he said the information had been arrived at by looking at well records in the area.

There will be flood conditions, according to Mr. Macdonald, if the requested density is allowed. He said all the water would drain to the north-west and would have to go across his property.

He said there is nothing to prevent an owner from putting in a swimming pool or chopping down trees unless it is written into the deed.

Another resident was concerned that if problems arose later then only the area residents would be left to contend with them. He also was of the opinion that the developer was a profiteer.

Mr. King warned the residents that the way the
