

Museum may takeover school

GREENWOOD — The old Greenwood Public School may be used by the Pickering Museum as an office and to store historical documents.

The unoccupied building could also be used for historical society functions, arts and crafts displays, and other town services, according to Museum board secretary Joe Myslik.

Pickering council last week approved a plan to lease the building for three years from the Durham Board of Education. The town, under a proposed agreement, would rent the building from the board and pay maintenance costs.

Clean-up operations will begin in the near future.
