Gospel Church to open Bible School for two-weeks

STOUFFVILLE — Summer Bible School is almost ready to open.

The inter-denominational event will start July 19, and will be held at the Bloomington Christian Gospel Church on the 9th Line, north of town. Hours will be from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. during the two weeks the school will be run.

Pastor and Mrs. C. W. Sorley and some volunteer assistants have been preparing for the annual event, and extend an invitation to local children to attend. The school is open to anyone between the ages of three and into the teens. All are welcome to attend, regardless of denomination.

As a technique, caricature and animation are used to convey the point that many children feel insecure due to an excess or a lack of discipline. Dr. Hendricks urges a long-term view, saying that parents should not be so concerned with the immediate reaction of their children, but with how the children will think of them 20 years hence. An honest relationship between parent and child is stressed, as the best method of instilling self-discipline in the child and in the family as a whole.
