NEWMARKET — York Regional Police Commissioner Gordon Cook of King Township, has bluntly told Regional Police Chief Bruce Crawford and the Board of Police Commissioners that he will not support any move by the Chief for the hiring of seven more officers for the Force.

Mr. Cook claims that too many men are presently being used to police radar units, particularly in the Wellington St. area of Aurora. Mr. Cook feels it's a waste of manpower and claims many area business men are complaining.

Mr. Cook's comments were in reference to Regional Council's approval of a \$7 million plus police budget, which was hacked by \$200,000. The Board is also faced with rising costs for vehicle insurance of over \$30,000.

"I'd be pleased to see one in front of my place every day," Commissioner Stewart Rumble of Markham told Mr. Cook in reply to his comments.

Chief Crawford told the Board that his department has had many complaints regarding drag stripping in the area which might account for extra radar on Wellington St.
