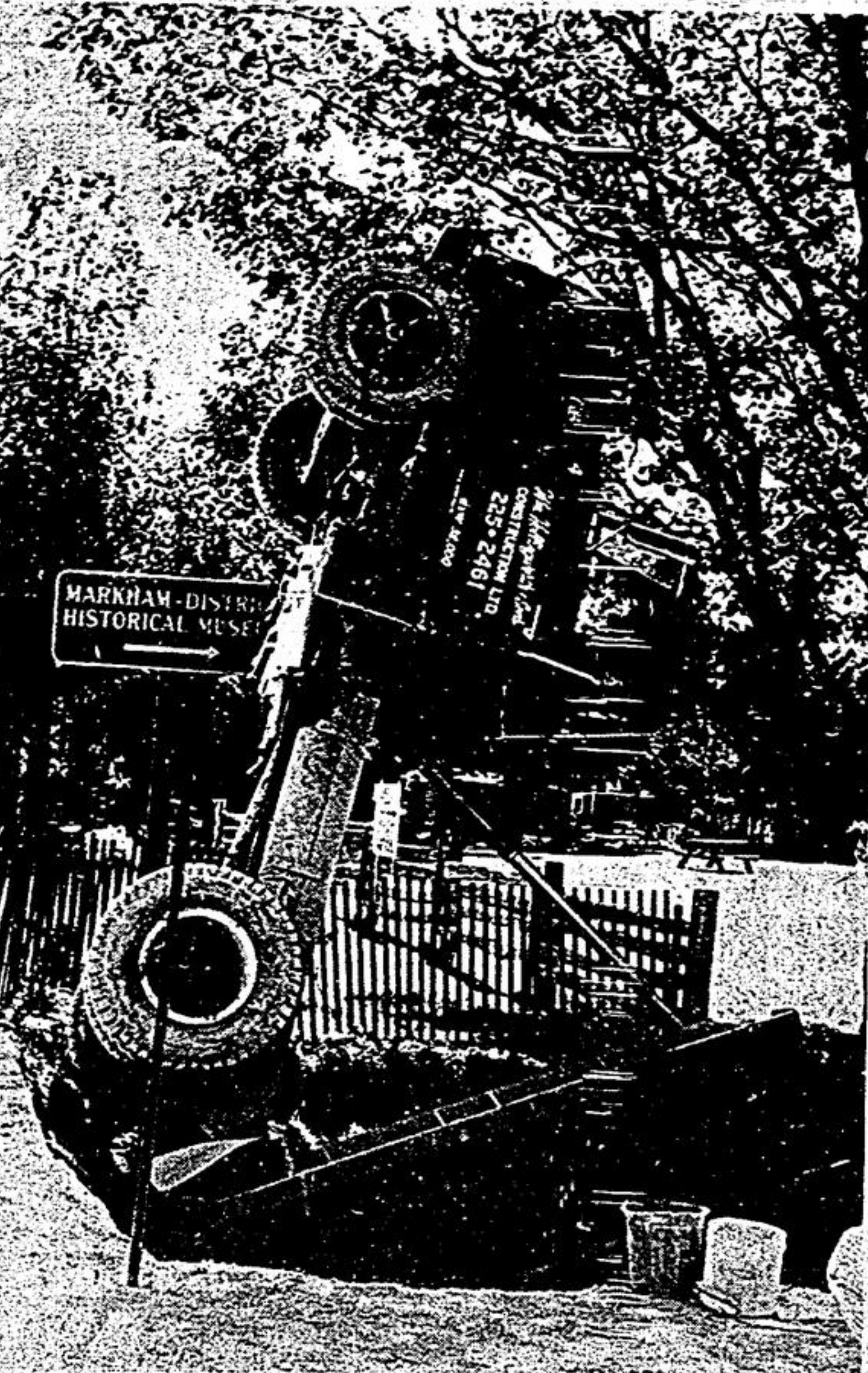

Arena plan accepted

UXBRIDGE - The Uxbridge Arena Board recently accepted a plan for rebuilding the arena, which had been declared unsafe by Ontario government inspectors, despite the fact that only \$15,000 of the \$250,000 needed has been raised so far. Construction of the new arena has been slated to begin in less than two months, and Harry Stemp, spokesman for the fund-raising committee, has expressed disappointment at the slow start. However, he expects things to get better as people return from their holidays. Mr. Stemp feels that summer is a bad time to organize things. In the meantime, the town council plans to borrow the money in order that the project will start in time. It is hoped that the first phase, which involves replacing the roof and enclosing the rink, will be finished by January 1.

Farmer Jack's in playoffs soundly beat Pickering team

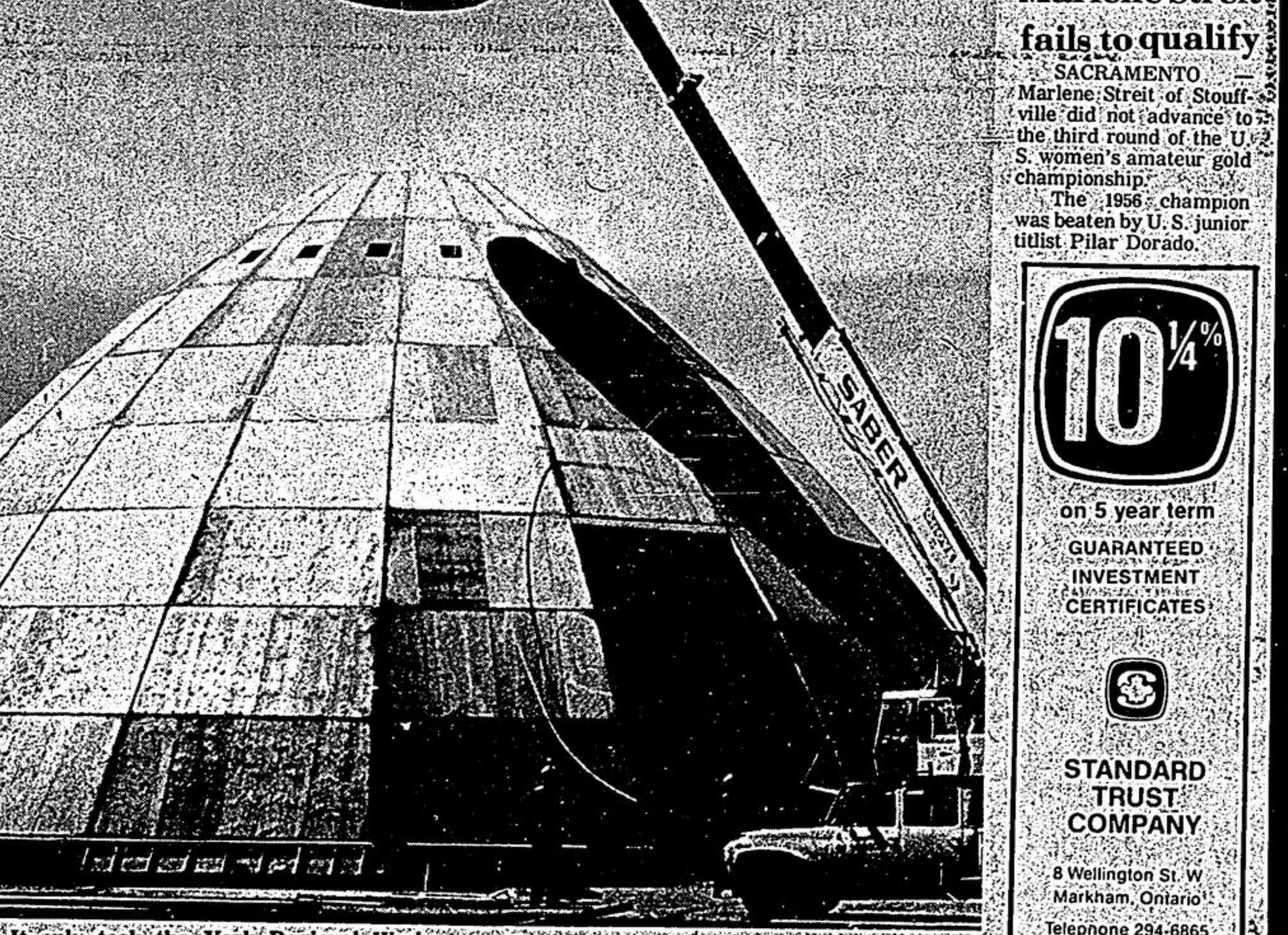
