**Mayor's report**

**Highway 48 truck traffic examined**

STOUFFVILLE — Truck traffic on Highway 48 in the Stouffville area will be under study by the Region of York, according to Mayor Gordon Ratcliff.

He said that he had requested at regional council that a proposed study of truck traffic through Markham include this area as well.

The mayor commented that under consideration will be the feasibility of a bypass to the east of both Markham and Stouffville.

Question: What is your view on the location of a truck terminal for Don Anderson Haulage on Highway 47, west of Stouffville.

Mr. Ratcliff said council is awaiting the

town planner's report on the approach to the village of Stouffville for consideration in the official plan.

"I would like the planner's comments to help me make my judgment," the mayor said. He added that "with proper screening I wouldn't say I'm totally opposed to it." With the location of a truck terminal there, however, he said "we're going to have a lot of pressure for more of the same kind of development."

Question: How soon will a condensed version of the official plan draft be available to the public, and will it be sent out in the mail to town residents?

The mayor said he thought the condensed

version ought to be ready about the second week in October and that a general mailing is "not required" for the official plan draft.

Those residents who want a copy will be able to obtain it for free at the town office. Mr. Ratcliff said

that the unabridged version will be available as well, for a price.

Question: How soon will council and the Preserve Our Water Resources group jointly approach the Ontario Ombudsman's office on the subject of the York

Sanitation Highway 48 dump?

Before going to the Ombudsman, the mayor said, solicitors for both POWR and council will be meeting to decide on the best material to go into a brief for the Ombudsman.

**Company fined for violations**

TORONTO — Puvon Investments Ltd. of Stouffville was found guilty recently of failing to comply with Construction Safety Act 1973 requirements covering the shoring of an excavation.

The company was fined a total of \$4,000, \$2,000 for each of two charges under the Act. The trial was held in Provincial Court, Criminal Division, before J. Akkanen, J.P. The company pleaded not guilty to both charges. No injury or loss of life resulted from the contraventions of the Act.

The charges resulted from inspections by Ministry of Labour of

officials of a construction site at 100 Pembroke Street in Toronto. During a routine inspection January 14, 1976, the inspector found that an excavation was improperly shored and issued a stop-work order. During a second visit on January 22, the inspector found that proper shoring was still not provided. Charges against the company were laid on March 1, 1976.

The Court was told that Puvon Investments Limited had previously been convicted on July 15, 1975, at Toronto of an offence under The Construction Safety Act and on that occasion fined \$750.00.

**Rejection of farming code**

YORK REGION — A provincial code designed to sort out conflicts between farm and non-farm uses was rejected last week by York Region's Land Division Committee.

According to Ministry of Education district representative Allen Wall, the code, published in June, could become law if municipalities include it in local bylaws.

The size of farms are monitored in the code, and it tries to halt air and water pollution. One aspect of the code recommends that residential areas be kept at least 1,200 feet from farm barns.
