STOUFFVILLE — Clipper goaltenders Rick Marshman and Jack Holder must have thought they were part of a Markham Fair midway game Saturday night as the Markham Junior B Royals fired 60 shots at them in defeating the Clippers 9-6.
The Stouffville squad led 5-1 at one point in the exhibition match, but ran out of steam during the last half of the game.
Markham's Joe Stasiuk scored four goals and teammate Steve George hit for two as the Royals showed superior conditioning and excellent forechecking. Single goals came from the sticks of Bill Newton, Dabe Robson, and Mike Kowalchuk. Defenceman Wayne Bishop picked up four assists.
For the Clippers, Kevin Barrick notched two goals with singles going to Doug Taylor, Ted Assink, Bill Meakes, and newcomer Damon Bennett. Both Holder and Marshman played well in the Stouffville net despite the score. The Clippers only managed 27 shots against the Royall's Jim Blake.
The game itself was a chippy affair, with Stouffville amassing 46 penalty minutes to Markham's 38.
Markham capitalized well on Clipper penalties and six of their goals were power play efforts.
The Clippers will open their regular season this Saturday night, Oct. 9, at 8 p.m. in the Stouffville arena. They will be matched against the Uxbridge Black Hawks.
