POP has expanded its scope

CEDAR GROVE — The anti-Pickering airport group POP, standing for People or Planes, has expanded its scope somewhat.

According to a newsletter announcing the first anniversary of the cancellation of the Pickering Airport the POP initials also stand for People Over Pollution, People Or Pavement, Preserve Our Pastures, People Or Politicians, People On Pity and People Or Pits.

Saturday POP held a Harvest Festival at the Cedar Grove Community Centre. One of the features of the festival was a demonstration of apple butter making, employing a copper kettle belonging to Austin Reesor. The kettle was brought from Pennsylvania by Mr. Reesor's ancestors in the late 1800's.

The Bluegrass group the Stouffville Stompers played until, as one observer expressed it, "Their fingers froze."

To raise funds preserves, vegetables, pumpkins and of course apple butter were sold.

The Tremaine Britannia Citizen's Group manned a display and handed out literature on recycling. The group is seeking support in their fight against a 500 acre landfill site proposed for Halton Region.

Reiterates his opposition to airport

MARKHAM — In view of Transport Minister Otto Lang's remarks last week regarding the proposed Pickering airport, I wish to restate the views of the people of Markham and our combined opposition to this project.

"Under no conditions do we desire or support the building of a new airport at Pickering. Our objection is based on both

factual and human terms as follows; at no time has the Government proven that a second airport site is absolutely necessary and at no time has the government proven that Pickering is the only logical site choice for that airport. Further, as stated by the people of Markham many times, our area is a community residential area. People have moved here to

establish a family way of life which is totally inconsistent with the needs and demands of an international airport."

"The Town of Markham has and will continue to resist the building of the Pickering airport, as this project would not only inconvenience thousands of people, but forever change the nature of our town."

Natives vow drastic action over grave excavations

PICKERING — To prevent "desecration" of Indian graves, Ontario's native people may be forced to take drastic action, according to Larry Johnson, a treaty research worker with the Union of Ontario Indians.

Mr. Johnson was upset that archaeologists digging at the site of the dormant Pickering Airport refused to recognize that disturbance of a grave from the 15th century is an indignity to the person buried there.

Just what form the drastic action would take Mr. Johnson declined to say, but he did cite the example of a band of American Indians, who armed with shovels, descended on a white community's cemetery and speedily got results.

No actual loss from no airport

DURHAM — An economic impact study prepared by Durham Region planning and development staff shows that there has been no actual loss to the region as a result of shelving the Pickering airport project.

However, a lot of opportunity for economic growth has been lost.

If the airport had been built, substantial hotel, development, manufacturing and retail services, air shipping, and other service industries would have provided thousands of jobs for area residents, as well as many new industries, the study said.
