Trustee loses bid for moratorium on group discussion of personal affairs

AURORA — The are cases of either bad judgment or bad use of a technique, he said.

He warned that parents hearing of isolated cases could become skeptical of what is happening in their own children's schools.

Citing the situation as "most exceptional", Mrs. Coburn said approval of the moratorium motion would be striking out at the entire school system.

A suggestion that the freeze be limited to schools where parents challenge group discussion and moral dilemma studies was turned down by Mrs. Horton.

While Thursday's session approved reducing the committee to a smaller, workable level, the first half of the proposal was lost on a 33 tie vote.

When the moratorium was defeated, Mrs. Horton and Markham trustee Christ McMonagle, both of whom backed the move, refused to support establishment of the new committee.

"It's too important to go away," Mrs. Horton said of her call for a halt to moral dilemma programs. "We're permitting exploitation of kids in York County because we bury our heads."

King trustee Margaret Coburn and Richmond Hill representative Warren Baile backed the new committee but argued the moral dilemma issue is not enough of a problem to condemn the entire system.

In considering widespread discussion of intimate family matters, "you're talking about a non-event," said Mr. Baile. "It just doesn't happen."

Both proposals still have to be approved by the full board. When the recommendations are presented to trustees Monday night, Mrs. Horton is expected to reintroduce her moratorium motion.

Local man sentenced to 15 days
