

Clippers play great offensive hockey

STOUFFVILLE — In a very impressive show of offensive power, the Ken May Real Estate Clippers crunched the Port Perry Flamings 10-3.

Fans at the high-scoring game saw some great offensive hockey although the defence seemed to be totally lacking. Only some good moves by the Clippers net minder kept the Flamings from connecting with more than six of the thirty-five shots on goal.

The Clippers scored twice in the first period with Clarridge scoring from Wayne Norton and Ted Assinck, and Vernoy notching his first goal of the season from Leitch

and Waite. The period saw just one minor penalty to Port Perry as the May squad outshot the Flamings 12-10.

Leitch scored a solo goal on an excellent effort just one minute before Barrick tallied from Bill Meakes. Twelve seconds later, Brown put the Clippers up 9-3 on a brilliant, unassisted goal

when he, in the words of a fan "decked the goalie right out of his shorts."

The Clipper attack faltered in the third period and despite outshooting the Flamings 13-8, they were outscored three to one.

John and Gord Scott each scored their second goal of the night while Phil Hennessey notched a single. Doug Taylor

replied for the Clippers from Perry Brown.

The Clippers currently find themselves in third place with eight points behind Bowmanville and Lindsay. The next test for the May club comes Friday night in Lindsay. They return home at 8 p.m. they take on Port Hope.
