## York Region dental clinics to open

**NEWMARKET** — Dental clinics have reopened in Newmarket and are expected to begin again in Richmond Hill next month. Dr. Kas Ambrozaitis, dental director for York Region, said last week:

The clinics resumed here Wednesday after the region hired a dental assistant, the director told the Board of Health. They will be held as they can be scheduled.

The board approved recommendations in a report to expand the

dental program encompassing senior citizens, pre-natal classes and handicapped.

However, the approval was subject to the availability of funds.

The dental department will continue its in-school program for students in kindergarten to grade five, and Dr. Ambrozaitis hopes to hire another assistant to run that program.

However, he said the clinics are valuable in educating families about proper dental hygiene.
