The first game saw Stouffville play Aurora High School and come away on the short end of a 47-26 score. Russ Davidson led the Spartans with 16 points in a game dominated by the height of the 'Gophers' from Aurora.

In the semi-final consolation game, the Spartans came out with a great deal of desire and hustle, and also a 54-22 victory over Woodbridge. Mike Lafleur led the team with 20 points, while Russ Davidson hit for 16, Mike Bowday scored 11, and Bill Kingsley added 5.

The victory over Woodbridge put the Spartans into the consolation championship against Thornhill and once again Stouffville ended up on the short end, this time losing 54-43. Again Mike Lafleur led the team, driving in for 17 points. Mike Bowday,

found his shooting eye and added 8, Bill Kingsley chipped in with six.

Earlier last week the Spartans opened their exhibition schedule at Langstaff with a 65-55 victory. Scoring was well spread in this first game as Mike Lafleur hit for 12, Eugene Reesor potted 11,

Dave Lang scored 10 and Russ Davidson and John Christie each added 8. Dave Hewitt, a grade 10 midget-aged player also scored four points.

The Spartans open their regular season this Friday at 3.30 p.m. when the Aurora Gophers again provide the opposition.

**MICHIGAN** — Two of Stouffville's finest young hockey players are currently starring below the border with American college teams. This past weekend, the two had occasion to meet off the ice.

Doug Todd, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. Todd, plays right wing alongside Danny Leig and Ben Kawa for the University of Michigan Wolverines, currently ranked number one in U.S. college hockey.

Todd and his Wolverine teammates played in Troy, New York, on the weekend, beating Rensselaer Polytechnical Institute Friday night 7 - 4. On Saturday night they lost 8

-7 to the same RPI team. Although Doug failed to score in either game, he did manage to set up linemate Kawa for three of his five goals.

Doug is enjoying hockey at Michigan and, apart from the problems of adjusting to a new way of life, has settled in well at Michigan. He plans to enter business school in the fall and is currently working to that end. His Michigan team has a 7 - 4 record this season.

Doug Feasby plays hockey in Schenectady, New York, just 15 miles from Troy. Doug is currently the premier centre with the Union College hockey team and in an inter-squad game Saturday night netted three goals. The son of Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Feasby, Doug plays between Don Marshall and Grant Judd, two sophomores from Michigan. All three are relatively small and lightning fast and make up Union's most potent line.

Unlike the University of Michigan, Union College is very small and in only its second year of hockey. The team is made up of sophomores and freshman and is coached by Ned Harkness.

As a freshman team last year, Union finished with a record of 20 wins and three losses. The city of Schenectady has gone hockey wild and as a result, the Union arena has been sold out for every home game since early November. Three thousand people were on hand for the inter-squad game Saturday night.

The two Dougs meet after Friday night's game in Troy and one couldn't help but notice their close bond through hockey.

Both hope, that, sometime in the next four years, it will be the University of Michigan Wolverines against the Union College Dutchmen for the U.S. college championship.

It may be sooner than they think.
