

# Collection, school renovations were major events in 1976

An issue that has dominated headlines, in The Tribune, perhaps ad nauseam to many, has been the York Sanitation Highway 48 dump. Council's efforts to close the site because of a possible danger to

Stouffville's water supply had little impact on the Ministry of the Environment, and a five-year certificate allowing the dump to continue operating was issued in early September.

The provincial government proved a bit more amenable, however, in approving funds for renovations and an addition to Summitview School. The long-sought money was made available after the York County Board of

Education agreed to shift money slated for an Orchard Park School addition to Summitview. That commenced the long process of approvals necessary before the expansion will be a reality.

A document that drew little public debate, but which will be extremely important in the town's future, was the interim official plan. The draft of the plan was formulated by the town planner and planning board and publicly discussed by residents and developers alike.

Official implementation of the plan is still years away, but the carefully worded document will likely play an important role in the meantime.

Members of the new council have generally pledged themselves to upholding the plan, although some questions concerning its extensive length and breadth have been raised.

The Town of Markham passed a milestone in 1976, as the old fairgrounds, site of Ontario's largest agricultural fair for the past 122 years, were used for the last time. Much more expansive and ample grounds are being constructed on the 7th line, Markham.


Of course, we are all aware by now of the village of Stouffville's 100th birthday this year, and excellent preparation for the event was made by the Centennial Committee during 1976.

The population of Stouffville continued to increase as mostly urban families moved into the newly completed College Park subdivision in town, seeking a more peaceful lifestyle.
