Man wants parkland considered for o.p.

STOUFFVILLE — A "public or private recreation park" has been proposed for land just east of the Stouffville Sales Barn and Deer Park Inn, on part of lots 2 and 3 concession 10.

Bruce Munro, owner of the land, asked that "the use of this land be taken into consideration when the Recreational Commercial Areas of the new Official Plan are being discussed, as I have spent considerable money on this endeavour over the past few years and will be ready to open on the 1st of June, 1977."

Mr. Munro described the proposed recreation area as "very similar to the Milne Conservation area which is adjacent to the south side of the Village of Markham and with the quality of Deer Park Inn."

Vandorf estate plan proposed

STOUFFVILLE — Planning board last week deferred action on a proposed estate residential development near Vandorf, until the next meeting.

The development is proposed for the west side of Don Mills Road, lots 9 and 10, south of the Bloomington Road. Immediately abutting the land to the west would be proposed Highway 404, with a possible interchange slated for 31 of the 88 acres in the parcel.

Mel Lyons, representing the developer, Bloomington Investments, told the board 27 acres would be used for residential, 14.7 for future commercial and 13 acres for park or open space.

He said 25 per cent of the land was tree-covered; there is no shortage of water and there would be no problem screening the development from Highway 404.

"We feel the site is an excellent one for estate residential development according to your own policy," he said.

In answer to questions by Ward 1 Councillor Jim Doble, Mr. Lyons said that a steep ravine, to be left untouched between residential areas did not contain standing water. Concerning farming of the land, he said "some" crops were planned there, but that they were rather restricted due to topography.
