STOUFFVILLE — Six years after its inception, Century City Mortgage Holder's Association has voted to disband.

A dinner and dance, held at Goodwood Community Centre Friday evening February 18, brought to a conclusion the need for the Association.

Seventy-five members of the Association and their immediate families joined together to make a presentation to chairman Grant Drewery of Stouffville and secretary Edna Meyers of Uxbridge. They were each given a beautiful wall clock in appreciation of their efforts during the long litigation proceedings.

It was in January 1971 that 44 affected people determined the necessity to combine their efforts to bring joint action against Century City Developments Limited who were then in default of their mortgage payments.

It was not until December 9, 1976 that the law firms of Shibley Righton and McCutcheon and Cassels Brock, both of Toronto, were finally able to bring to a successful conclusion their actions in respect to the mortgages. Representing the Association members were the renowned litigation lawyers Richard Shibley and Pierre Genest, along with their junior partners Alan Bromstein and John Day. During the 6 year period lawyers Barry Wortzman and Thomas Ricketts also worked on the case. Early in the proceedings Donald Hindson of Cattanah and Hindson, of Markham, assisted. He and John Day were guests at the dinner party. Shibley and Genest sent their regrets.
