Speaking competition

The final competition of the Lions Club public speaking contest, district A16 for grades six, seven and eight was held at the Grace Anglican Church in Markham last week. The Stouffville Lions Club was well represented by Zena Kamocki, of St. Marks Separate School, who placed second in the girls' competition for her speech on the ancient civilization of Atlantis. Tanya Holme from Markham, who spoke about the slaughter of baby seals captured first place. In the boys competition Ed Canning won

first for his Fortune Telling speech. Brain Jones from Claremont placed second with a speech about Milk. Geoff Sherrer from Dickson Hill Public School placed fourth with his speech on fans at sports events. Trophies were presented to the winning speakers, and they also received a cheque for \$100 and have been invited to speak to the delegates at the Lions District A16 convention in Lindsay on April 17.

Every major urban transit project in the York-Simcoe area has been put in jeopardy because the federal government reneged on a 1974 Liberal election promise: York-Simcoe MP Sinclair Stevens claimed recently. The election promise was to inaugurate a \$290 million program to aid urban transit in Canada. A petition was sent to Mr. Stevens' constituents which urges the government to reconsider its decision "and honor this vital commitment." Mr. Stevens is the Progressive Conservative Member of Parliament who is his party's finance critic in the House of Commons. In a recent speech to the Commons, Mr. Stevens said the share of the Trudeau government promise for the Ontario Barrie-Oshawa-Oakville community area would have amounted to over \$55 million. He accused the Trudeau government of short changing the area by that much "with respect to the commitments they offered in the last election campaign."

There is nothing town council can do about junk mail blowing about in the streets, it was decided last week. Council received a letter from Robert H. Jones of Stouffer St. requesting that something be done about the numerous flyers and advertising supplements which are deposited on driveways, footpaths and doorsteps. He cites the unsightly mess of blowing papers, or alternatively a soggy mess of junk mail on the doorstep. "What could you do, our elected representatives of the community, to limit this nuisance. There must be some anti-litter by-law," concludes Mr. J. Jones. Councillors Eldred King and Jim Doble expressed doubt that council had any control over what was delivered to people's doorsteps, and June Button said that enforcement would be a problem: "We can't even enforce the Clean Yards Bylaw," she stated. Bill Kamps blamed the mess on the kids that deliver the handbills and suggested Mr. Jones follow the example of some doctors, and simply not buy from any company that send unsolicited matter to him.
