ARE YOU ELIGIBLE TO VOTE on Thursday, June 9th?

Qualified voters must be on the NEW List of VOTERS in order to vote.

It's up to YOU to get on the list! DO IT NOW!

Check Now - do YOU have form 103?

Check - IN ORDER TO VOTE - IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY AND NO ONE ELSE'S TO GET YOUR NAME ON THE NEW LIST OF VOTERS.

Check - PHONE the Returning Officer in your Electoral District for the necessary information of how to get on the List of Voters - at the number listed below. Listen carefully and have a pen and paper ready to jot down the information.

Check - RURAL RESIDENT? If you live in a rural area, and are qualified to vote, it will be much easier for you to vote on Election Day (June 9th), if your name is on the List of Voters. However, qualified rural voters, not on the list before Election Day, may still get on the list and vote by having a friend or neighbour on the same polling subdivision list "vouch" for them on Oath at the polling place.
