Record set at lifting meet

Last Saturday at the Stouffville District

Secondary School's 16-year-old Olympic weightlifter lifted 286 pounds above his head to establish a new Ontario and Canadian record.

Steve Diotte from the Atomic Weightlifting Club at Elliot Lake did two successful lifts to get the record. The first lift was the snatch, which involves pulling the weight in one complete motion from the floor up over the head, was 220 pounds. The second lift, the clean and jerk, is a lift in two parts starting from the floor up to the shoulder blades for the clean. After the lifter has recovered his balance the weight is pushed or jerked straight

up over his head to an arms locked position.

Steve successfully lifted 286 pounds in the clean and jerk.

The Stouffville lifters belonging to the Spartan Weightlifting club also met with a great deal of success as Scott Brown led the team with lifts of 35 kilograms, 80 pounds, in the snatch and 100 pounds in the clean and jerk. Scott weighs 98
