Uxbridge promises ice will be available

UXBRIDGE — The Uxbridge Minor Hockey Association came before Uxbridge council last week and asked council what has been happening with the plans to build a new arena.

The Association represented by Robert Risebrough, past president, wanted to find out if there would be ice ready for the upcoming hockey season.

Mr. Risebrough commented that the Association represents 550 children and that because there have been no concrete plans made by council, pledges from the public are not coming in.

Council reported to Mr. Risebrough that plans are being made for the new arena, but the main stumbling block is finding a suitable site.

Ward 4 councillor Sandy Ewen explained that the new arena is top priority, but "we are having a rough time getting a site. We've come close a few times but there hasn't been anything finalized yet."

Mr. Ewen also commented that, if needed, council will hire an engineering firm to repair the old arena, which has been condemned as being unsafe. "It would be just a temporary measure if we can't get the site in time for next year. We're hoping to know before August 1st."

Ward 3 councillor Norm Lyons also pointed out that getting the land was the hardest part. "It is a lot tougher than it looks, it's costly to service some of the lots we've considered and we feel that lots should be serviced. It looks like we will be using the old arena for one more year, there's no way we can count on the new arena being ready in time."

When Mr. Risebrough complained that the August 1st date would be too late in the year for the arena to be built in time, Mr. Ewen assured him that "if we don't have a new site we can use the old arena for one more year as long as it is brought up to standards and monitored. The only thing we have to do is show that plans are going ahead for the new one."

Mr. Ewen then said council has a letter from the Ministry of Labour stating that if plans are being made it would be possible to use the old arena under monitored conditions.

Council assured Mr. Risebrough and the association that ice would be available for the next season by the time the association has made up their schedules.

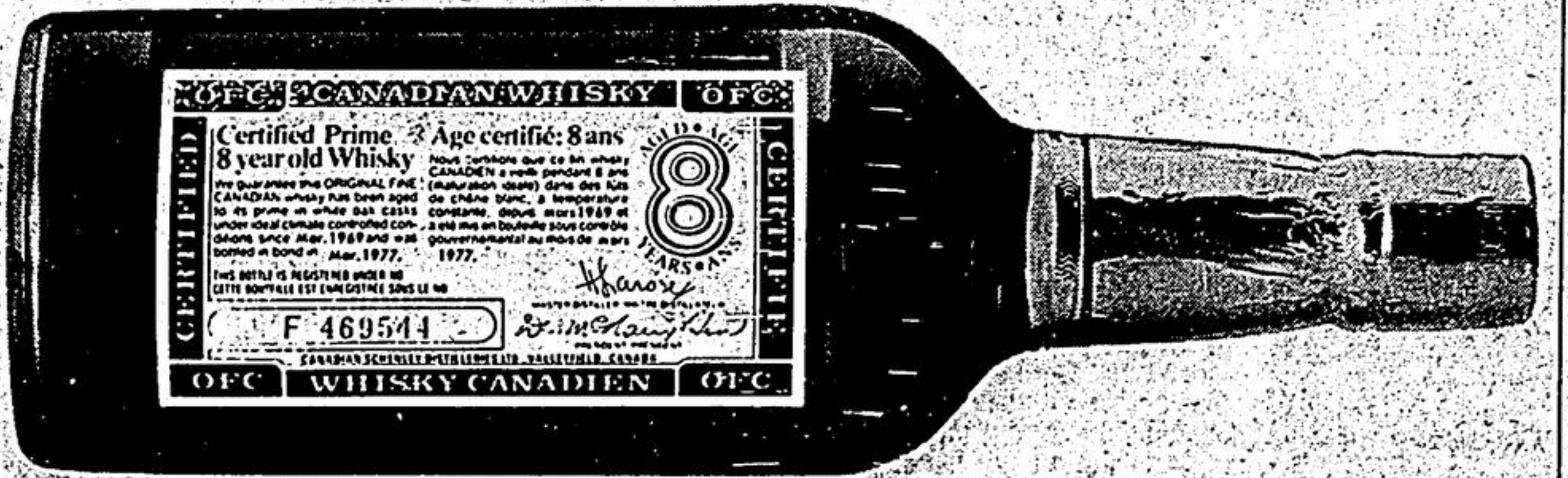
