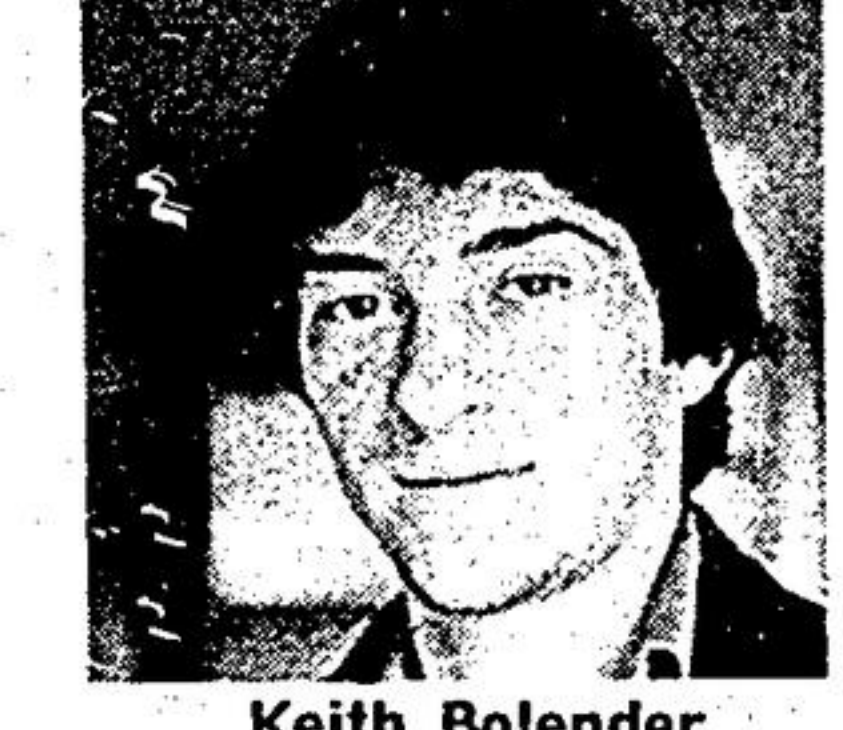

The Tribune follows the growth of the Newspaper Industry, moving from the hot type letterpress, to the most up to date methods of printing, in offset and colour process.

In 1965 The Tribune became a division of Inland Publishing Co. Ltd., one of the largest suburban newspaper groups in the country. During the 89 year history, the paper has promoted all the major and civic projects, such as— modern sewage system, winter sports facilities, education facilities etc.

It is interesting to note, that The Tribune, during the 1930's, was responsible for obtaining a Town Clock for the community.

The Tribune has won recognition throughout the Country as a prize winning publication, and has more than 30 award Certificates to show for its achievements in both editorial and advertising fields. The first recognition came with the winning of the Joseph Clark Memorial Trophy in 1939.

Publishers have also gained distinction, present publisher, C.H. Nolan having served as president of the Ontario Weekly Newspaper Assoc., and in 1964 as National President of the Canadian Community Newspaper Association, and at the present, a vice president with Inland Publishing Co. Ltd.
