Mary Neal, of Claremont, passed away suddenly at Blind River Hospital, on June 20th. Miss Neal attended Claremont Public School, later she attended and graduated from Ontario Bible College in 1942. Volunteering to help with the Canadian Sunday School Mission, she taught Vacation Bible schools in the Thunder Bay district two summers. Then she was appointed to go to Sault Ste. Marie to begin Sunday School work among the children in the rural areas. For 33 years Mary faithfully travelled thousands of miles to country schools — conducting vacation Bible Schools and organizing and conducting Sunday Schools in areas and communities without churches. During the school term September to June, she taught Religious Education regularly to over 150 classes. At her retirement a year ago, she was highly honoured by pupils — teachers — principals and superintendents of education for her contribution to thousands of pupils.
