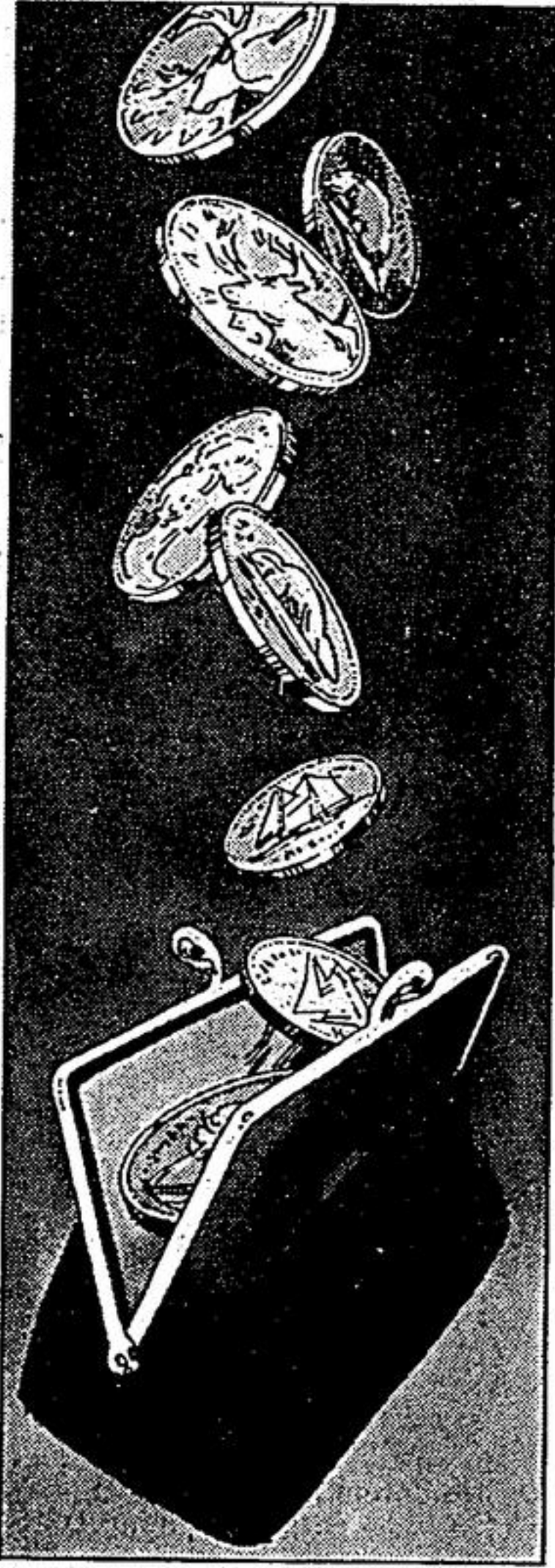
In the previous week's race, there were 148 birds entered in the meet, and the birds were let off in Timagami.
