Table soccer big time sport

There's a new soccer game in town, but this one is played on a table.

It's called Subuteo and a demonstration of the game will be shown at the Upper Canada Mall in Newmarket this Friday and Saturday with participants from Newmarket, Richmond Hill and Stouffville taking part in a Subuteo tournament on Saturday. The game is being introduced to North America after a successful 30 years of play in Europe. It is being distributed by House of Games in Toronto, and George Daglish, product manager, explained the game.

He commented that it is played with 11 plastic men, and the game has no mechanical parts. Two players are required and they flick the men around the table with their hands to control the ball and position the men.

"The game is played with regular soccer rules, offsides, penalties, everything a real soccer game has. There is also a complete set of accessories — floodlights, stands, spectators, that come with the game," Mr. Daglish said.
