

Festival of alternative lifestyles

Seneca College, in cooperation with the Ated Centre for Environmental Communities, will present Eco-Fair - a festival of alternatives on October 15, 1977 at the King Campus. This year's theme is 'Consumption-Conservation, What Balance?'

Eco-Fair is being developed in two parts. A market-style exhibition will allow the visitor to wander from display to display investigating various forms of energy, alternate life style demonstrations, new and different modes of shelter, and developments in food and agriculture. The focus of the exhibition will be the practical application of the latest advances in technology and the presentation of the usable information on ecologically aware living.

The second part of Eco-Fair will be lectures, films and discussions in the new Phase I complex at King Campus. There will be an opportunity for all participants to attend a variety of exciting

presentations and to mix these with visits to the exhibits. The presentations will be directed to the development of technologies and life styles which 1) contribute

to an ecologically sound way of supporting human life; 2) minimize the use of non-renewable resources; 3) avoid a cumulatively degrading effect on the environment; 4) do not require more materials than will be available if the earth's resources were equitably distributed among the world's people's.

Eco-Fair, a Festival of Alternatives, will begin at 9 a.m. The admission fee of \$3 (50 cents for children under 16) includes parking and all

lectures, films and displays. The King Campus is located on Dufferin St. just north of the King side road, 15 mi. from Metro Toronto. The Fair will continue into the

evening and will feature a special indoor evening program. Food and beverages will be available throughout the day. For further in-

The Commission of Inquiry on Aluminum Wiring has just completed a series of hearings in Toronto.


