Home renewal

Three townships in Durham-York will be receiving grants from the ministry of housing for the Ontario home renewal program.

The township of Scugog is participating in this program for the first time and will be receiving a cheque in the amount of \$60,000. Scugog is eligible for a total of \$98,232 during this fiscal year and can still apply for the balance of over \$38,000. I am pleased that Scugog has decided to enroll as I know there are many home owners who are anxious to apply for the program.

Uxbridge Township is participating for the second year and will be receiving a cheque for \$25,000 which represents the first installment of the \$96,452 for which they are eligible.

Brock Township has found this program highly successful and has been enrolled since 1974. This year, Brock is eligible for a total of \$88,153 and a cheque for \$29,000 has been approved at this time.

The purpose of this program is to assist occupants of residential property in repairing and upgrading their home to standards established locally and acceptable to the Ministry of Housing.

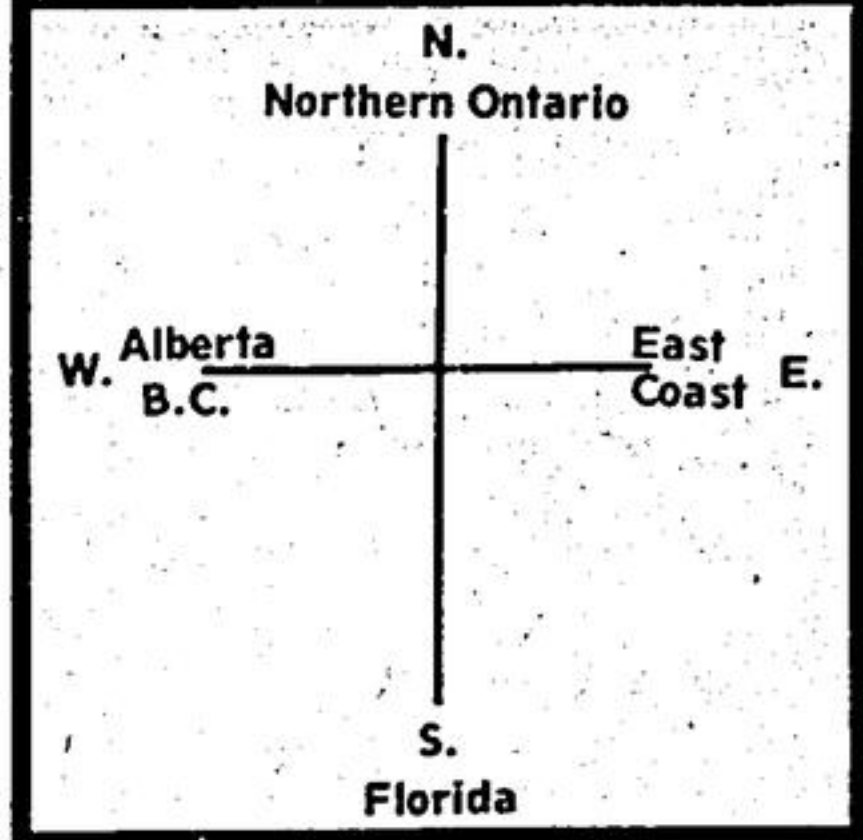
