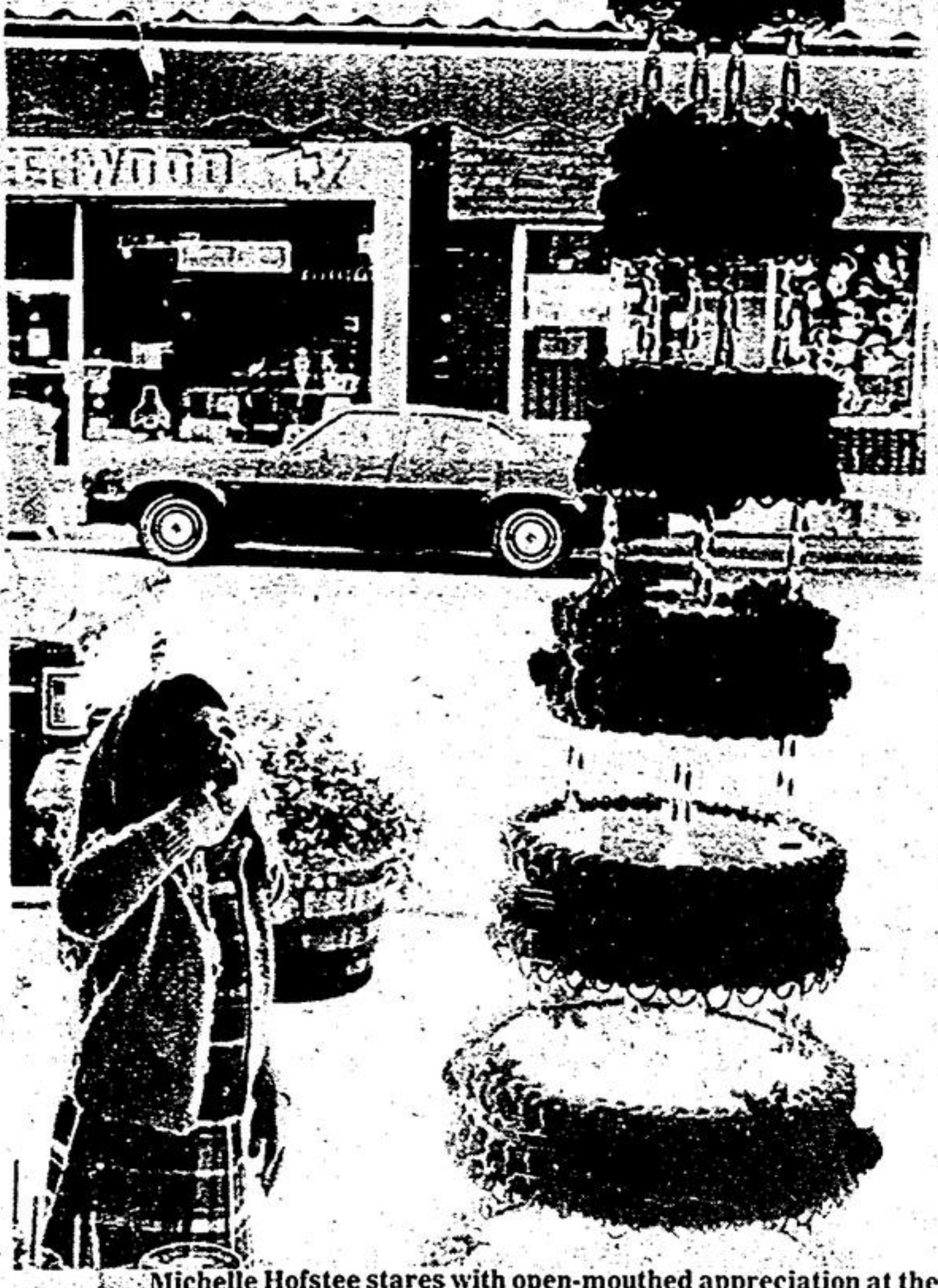

A witness, Richard Fitzsimmons, said he was holding the ladder and saw Tyler reach the cat, then he felt a jolt and fell to the ground. Tyler and the cat were dead at the scene.

The United Way of York Region got this year's campaign officially underway last Monday night at the Rolling Hills Golf and Country club.
Ken Foss, who has an extensive background in radio work, including being at one time the voice of the Toronto Argonauts football club, was master of ceremonies for the \$25 a plate dinner.
Opening greetings were handled by John Steveson, this year's president of York Regions United Way and by Stouffville Mayor Gord Ratcliff.
The United Way's ideals and goals were discussed by the evenings special guest speaker, Herve Lanctot, United Way's past president.
Mr. Lanctot talked about how the United

Way serves as a composite for many social service agencies, thereby eliminating the need of continually giving, "you only have to give once for all the services," he said.
He also suggested that the agencies keep in better contact with individuals. "There is a need for the agencies to tell the people how they are doing, not just when they want money, but all year round. If the people know the good and bad things about us they will become more involved," Mr. Lanctot commented.
The campaign goal for York region is \$400,000.
The evening ended on a light note with guest speaker Jim Coleman, a noted sports columnist, telling a number of anecdotes about newspaper business in Western Canada in the 1930's.
