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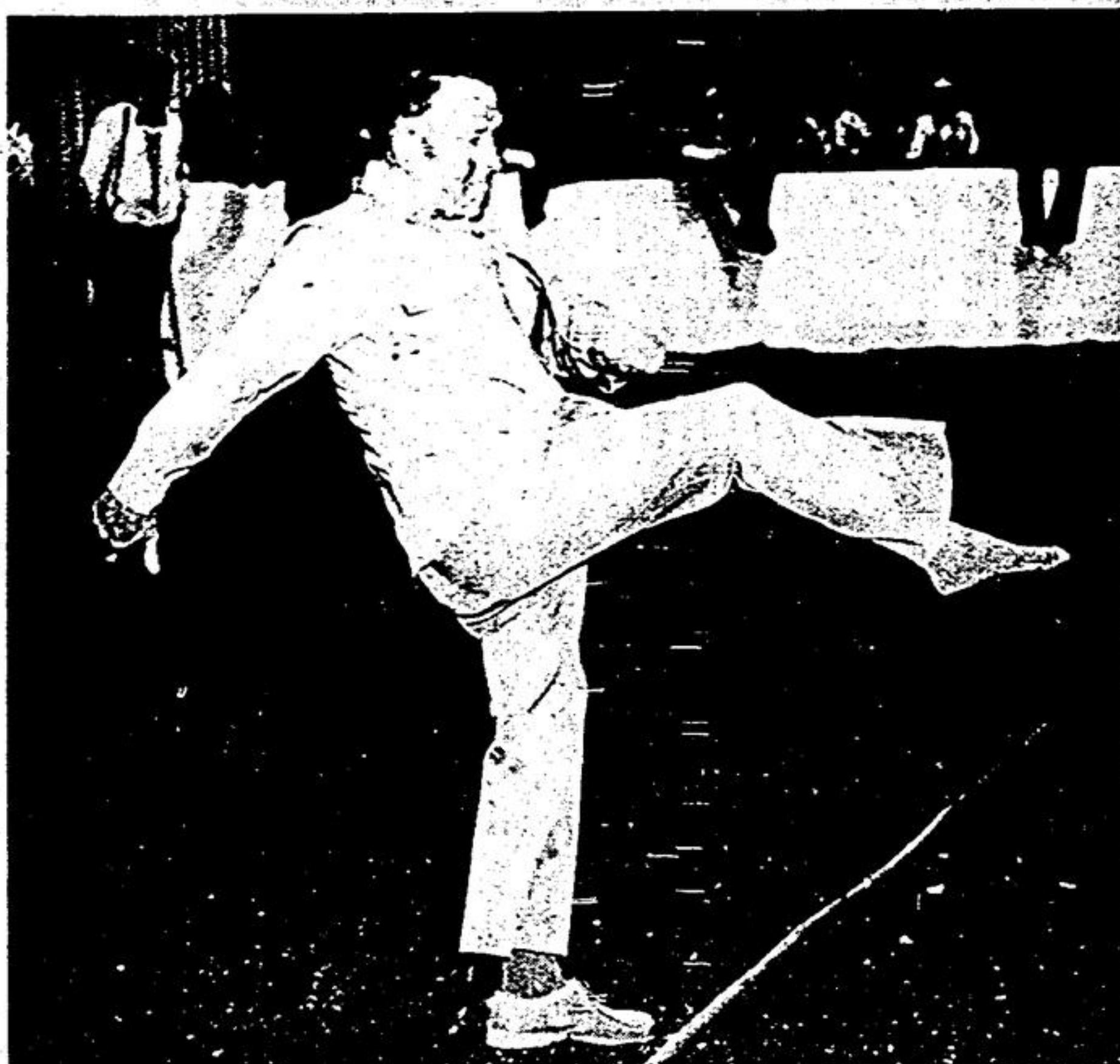

THE EXPROPRIATIONS ACT

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER OF AN APPLICATION BY THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE 'A' HERETO IN THE TOWN OF WHITCHURCH - STOUFFVILLE IN THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE ELIMINATION OF THE JOG IN MCCOWAN ROAD AT THE STOUFFVILLE ROAD

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described in Schedule "A" hereto. Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

(a) in the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or, when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;

(b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

NOTES:

1. The Expropriations Act provides that,

(a) Where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;

(b) the inquiry officer,

(i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and

(ii) may be recommended to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:

"Owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.

3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.

Racist landlord has to apologize-pay \$200

TORONTO — An Ontario Human Rights Code Board of Inquiry has found that a Gormley landlord discriminated against his tenant because of the "race, color and place of origin" of the tenant's dinner guest.

Professor Mary Eberts, of the University of Toronto Law School, acting as a Board of Inquiry under the code, found that Montford Johnstone of Gormley evicted Brigitte Jahn because she entertained a

black in her home. Professor Eberts found this eviction to be in violation of Section 3 (1) (b) of the code.

The board report was received by the Ontario Human Rights Commission on Sept. 21, and made public on Sept. 26.

In her decision, Professor Eberts said this Board of Inquiry is the first to consider the meaning and application of the code provision forbidding discrimination because of the charac-

teristics, not of the tenant, but of "any person or class of persons".

"Householders who extend the warmth of family ties or of hospitality to people of different origins should not be deterred from doing so by the intervention of those to whom they look for security of tenure," the decision stated.

Professor Eberts ordered Mr. Johnstone to send letters of apology to

Ms. Jahn and her guest and to inform the Ontario Human Rights Commission of any vacancy in rental accommodation owned by him, for a two-year period.

She has also ordered Mr. Johnstone to pay Ms. Jahn \$200 for damages for the injury to her dignity caused by his contravention of the code and special damages to compensate her for her moving expenses, and the difference between her rent in Gormley and her

rent at her new accommodation, for the period from November 1976 to May 1977.

Boards of Inquiry are appointed by the Minister of Labour under section 14(a) (1) of the Code after conciliation efforts by the Commission have failed to result in a

resolution. The Chairman of a Board of Inquiry under the code is independent of the commission and may make any order he or she sees fit to bring remedy, if it is found that discrimination did take place.

Bylaw to control trail bikes being drafted by council

STOUFFVILLE — Residents who have been annoyed by buzzing trail bikes may be relieved to know that council is working on having a bylaw drafted to control the noisy nuisances.

Previously the town had endorsed a resolution by the town of Aurora that the same regulations apply to trail bikes as snowmobiles, but the Department of Trans-

portation and Communications has recommended that a separate bylaw be drafted.

However, councillor Bill Kamps thinks more drastic measures are necessary to curb trail riders.

"We'll have to put the police on bikes as well to catch them," he commented, "they'll never catch them, otherwise."

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
