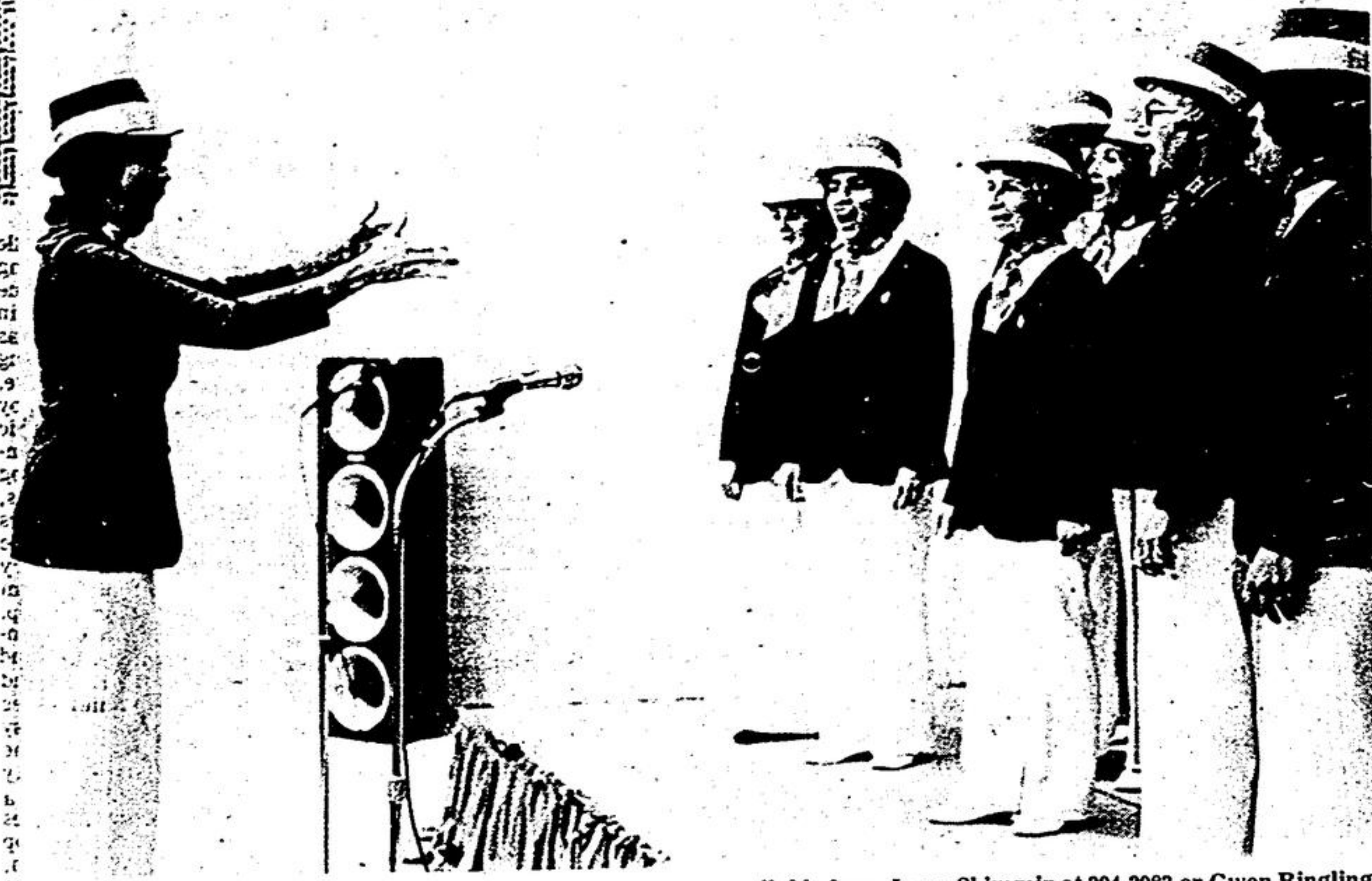
Dorothy Doust and Mina Wilson of Toronto had Thanksgiving dinner with Mr. and Mrs. Howard Bolender.
