Council policy under fire

STOUFFVILLE — only one dwelling per lot. Council last week had a tough time as they tried to stick to their policy of James Murphy requested permission to rebuild an old shed on his 31 acre farm on the Stouffville Rd. in order to accommodate the full time help he needs to tend

his valuable horses. Mr. Murphy argued that since the shed, had been used as a residence two years ago, it would be a continuation of a non-conforming use and he should be granted a building permit.

Councillor Bill McNalley did not see it that way. "I couldn't support fixing that shed up," he said. Mr. McNalley suggested that he put up a modular home instead, so that when the building is no longer needed, it can be removed.

This did not meet with the mayor's approval, however. "I don't like to see modular homes, I would rather have a real home and tie it up in some way," he said. One of the main concerns of council is that once two dwellings are allowed on a lot, the owner will apply for a severance on the ground that he can't keep up both places.

A lack of communication between the village of Claremont and Pickering town council has led to the suggestion of forming a Claremont community association, by the village's Lions Club.

IBM coming to Markham

Les Parker, bulletin editor for the Claremont Lions Club is sending a letter to all residents in the Claremont postal code outlining the suggestion and announcing a meeting to form the association.

MARKHAM — IBM will be moving to new office facilities in the Town of Markham Mayor Tony Roman announced at a press conference Monday.

headquarters will be moved from Don Mills to the new site when the complex has been completed in 1982.

In the letter Mr. Parker commented on the communication problem with council, despite councils attempts to improve the village's facilities.

The announcement was made jointly, at the Buttonville municipal offices by the Markham mayor and IBM President Lorne K. Lodge.

About 2,000 people will be employed there but it is impossible to say how many local jobs will come available as many staff members will be transferred there. The company now has 6,000 employees in Metro.

The company will be closing within the next few weeks, the deal for purchase of an 82 acre site on the north side of Steeles Ave., west of the 5th line (Victoria Park Ave.).

Mr. Lodge said the project is only in the initial stages of development and architect's conceptual drawings do not yet exist. Mr. Lodge would give no estimate of the cost of land and buildings.

Markham hydro meetings

The Markham Hydro Electric Commission will sponsor three public meetings early next month to give citizens an opportunity to offer comments on various alternatives for restructuring the Hydro service in York Region. Meetings will be held November 7 at the Markham Community Centre, Highways 7 & 48, and November 14 at the

Thornhill Community Centre. Don McNabb, chairman of the Markham Hydro Commission says copies of a technical report may be obtained from the Markham Hydro office for study prior to the meetings. "We have already made them available to numerous ratepayer groups and are

anxious to receive feedback from all interested parties."

Being considered for York Region are a number of options to restructure the utility service in light of disparities which have existed since the municipal boundaries were altered under regional government.

Welfare payments up slightly

YORK REGION — Welfare and unemployment payments are up slightly in York although the region still has one of the lowest unemployment rates in Ontario.

Alan Wells, director of the Health and Social Services administration branch recently told the health and social services committee that the number of people receiving assistance is 47 per cent of the region's 200,010 population. Up from 37 per cent at the same time last year.

Mr. Wells said that statistics indicate the unemployment rate is rising as a result of recent layoffs in the region. He said that the percentage of unemployed rarely goes higher than one per cent which gives the region a comparatively low rate.
