## Skaters times down

The power skating session has passed the midway mark and the skaters' efforts have resulted in their clocked skating times being markedly reduced! Nearly all skaters reduced their times, the reductions being most noticeable among our young, first year skaters.

In the 8-9 a.m. session the skaters showing the most improvement are: Cable Baker (5 yrs.) first time, 26 sec. — second time 10 sec.; Craig Stronach (6 yrs.) first time, 20 sec. — second time 7 1/2 sec.; Brian Bichener, (5 yrs.) first time 21 sec. — second time 10 sec.; and Greg Evans (5 yrs.) first time 20 sec. — second time 13 sec. That's a total reduction of 46 1/2 seconds!

Our skaters in the 9-10 a.m. session have worked very hard to make reductions in their times. The most improved skaters in this session are: Ronald Gibson, Russell Beaton, and Vince Tolton, all reducing their times from 6 sec. to 4 sec.

Our professional instructor, Kathy Snazel, is well pleased with the progress being made, but points out that even further effort will be required to further reduce times. Let's go!

It was a busy week for the Neil Patrick Polar Bears who played two games away and one on home ice.

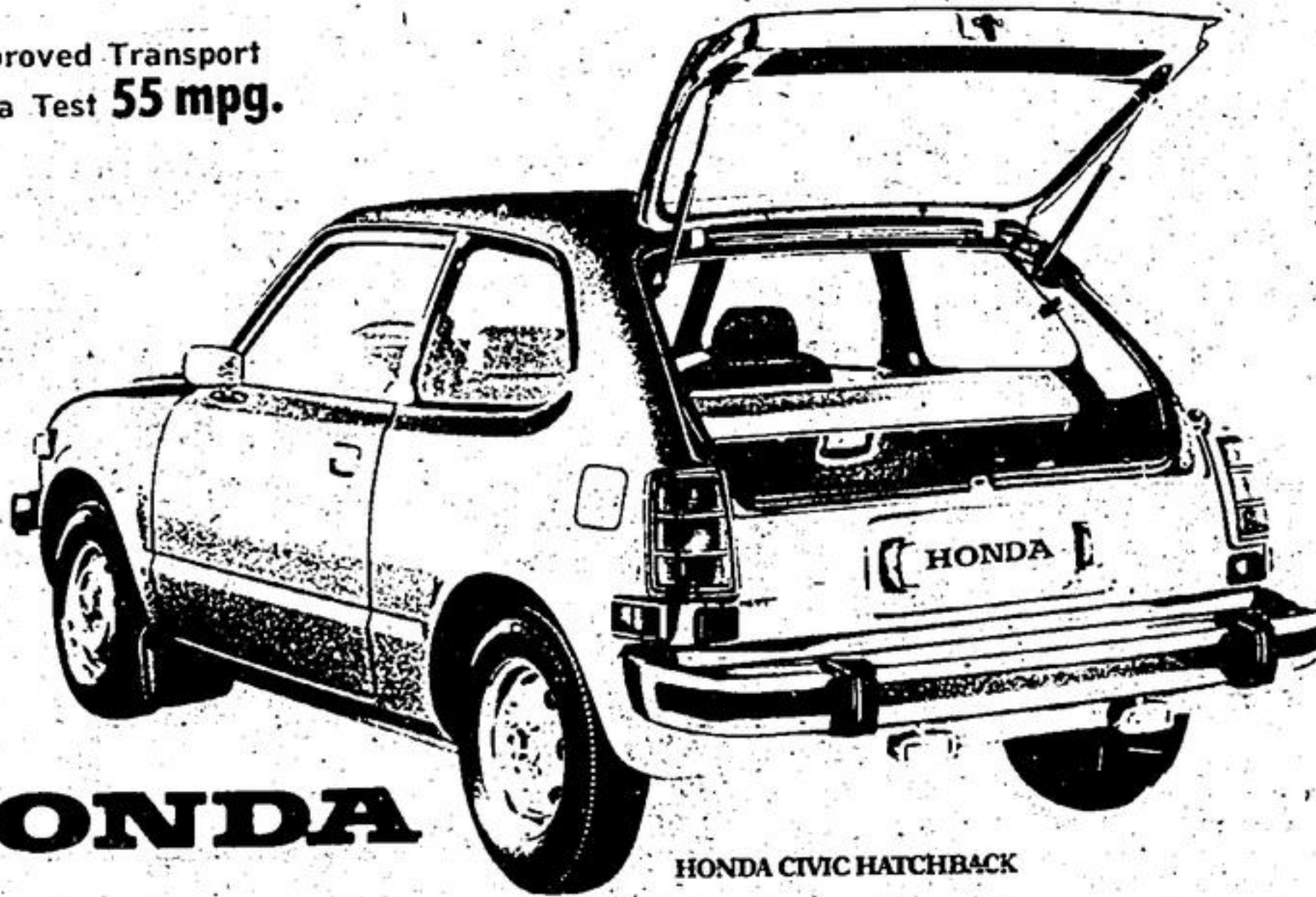
