The club has already held one meeting, according to Lee Jenkins, one of the organizers.

Mr. Jenkins said that after the incident riders became concerned that they would not be allowed to ride in the town, so they held a meeting to form the club.

The Pickering Outdoor Recreation Association also had a part in forming the club. The Association is the first of its kind in Canada. The town is attempting to establish a committee representing horseback riders, snowmobilers, hikers, trailbike riders, hunters and other outdoor enthusiasts to get their input into the planning process of the town to provide for their activities.

"So it was the combination of the two, the scare on the North Pickering Trail and the establishment of this committee, which prompted us to set up the equestrian club," says Mr. Jenkins.

The club organizers have sought information on other equestrian clubs in this area to get an idea of what goals they should pursue.
