Mount Zion will be holding a Christmas Euchre at 8 p.m. December 23.

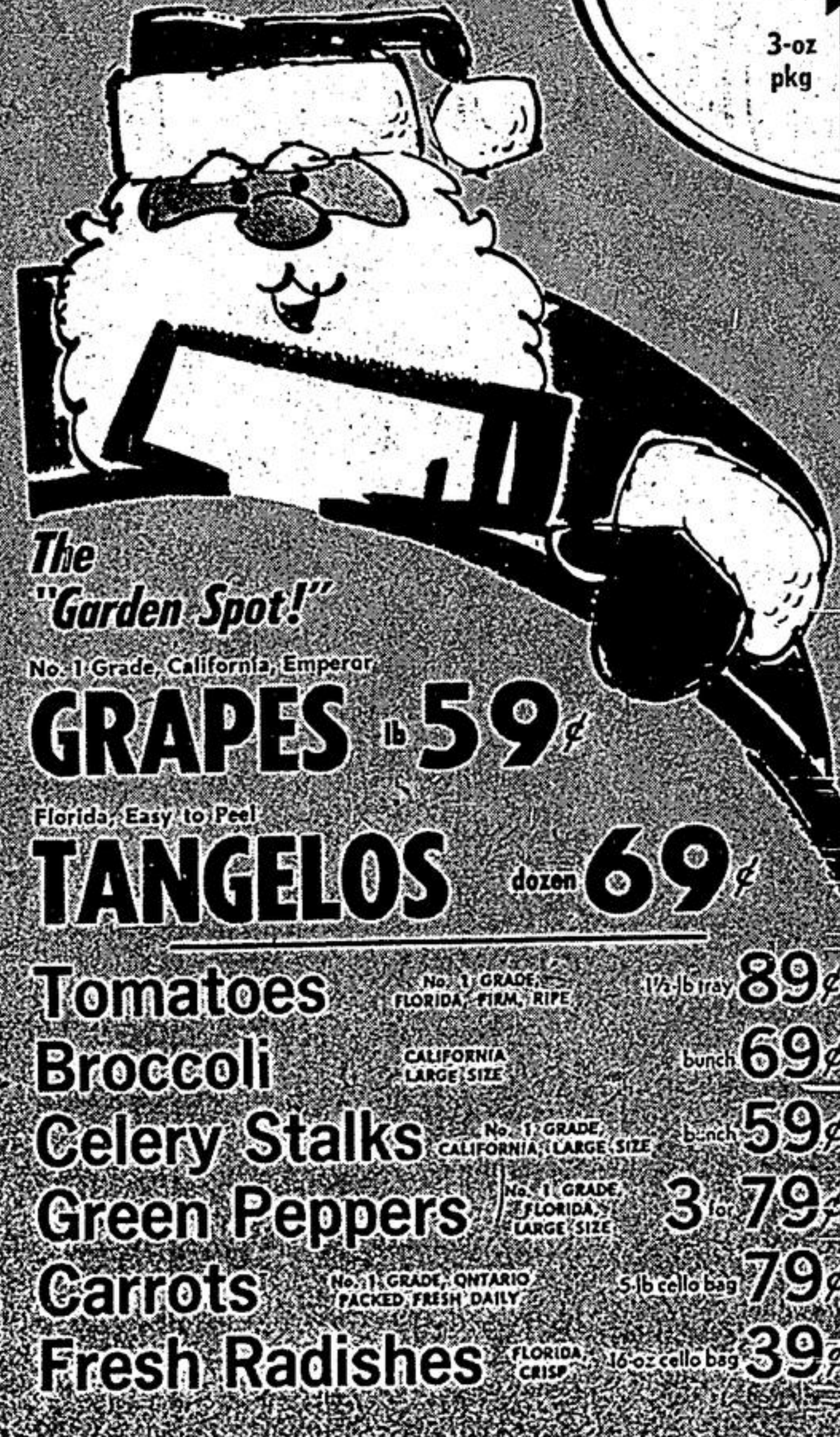
