It appeared their problems would be solved earlier as Repac Construction Company offered their services to remove the snow. However, a question of jurisdiction came up concerning the provincial Highway 47 and a meeting was called between Repac, Uxbridge Road superintendent Wall and representatives from the Ministry of sportation and Communications (MTC).

At council's meeting Mr. Wall handed in the results of his discussions. He stated in a letter that MTC had agreed to aid in the removal of snow from the south side of 47 from the top of the hill to Tindall lane. The town-

Mayor Gord Davie noted that the township and MTC have agreed to remove the snow just one time, "we are not comthis all the time, just this

once," he said. Councillor John Paxton, who represents Goodwood, said there is a definite safety hazard in the hamlet. He read a letter from a resident who
