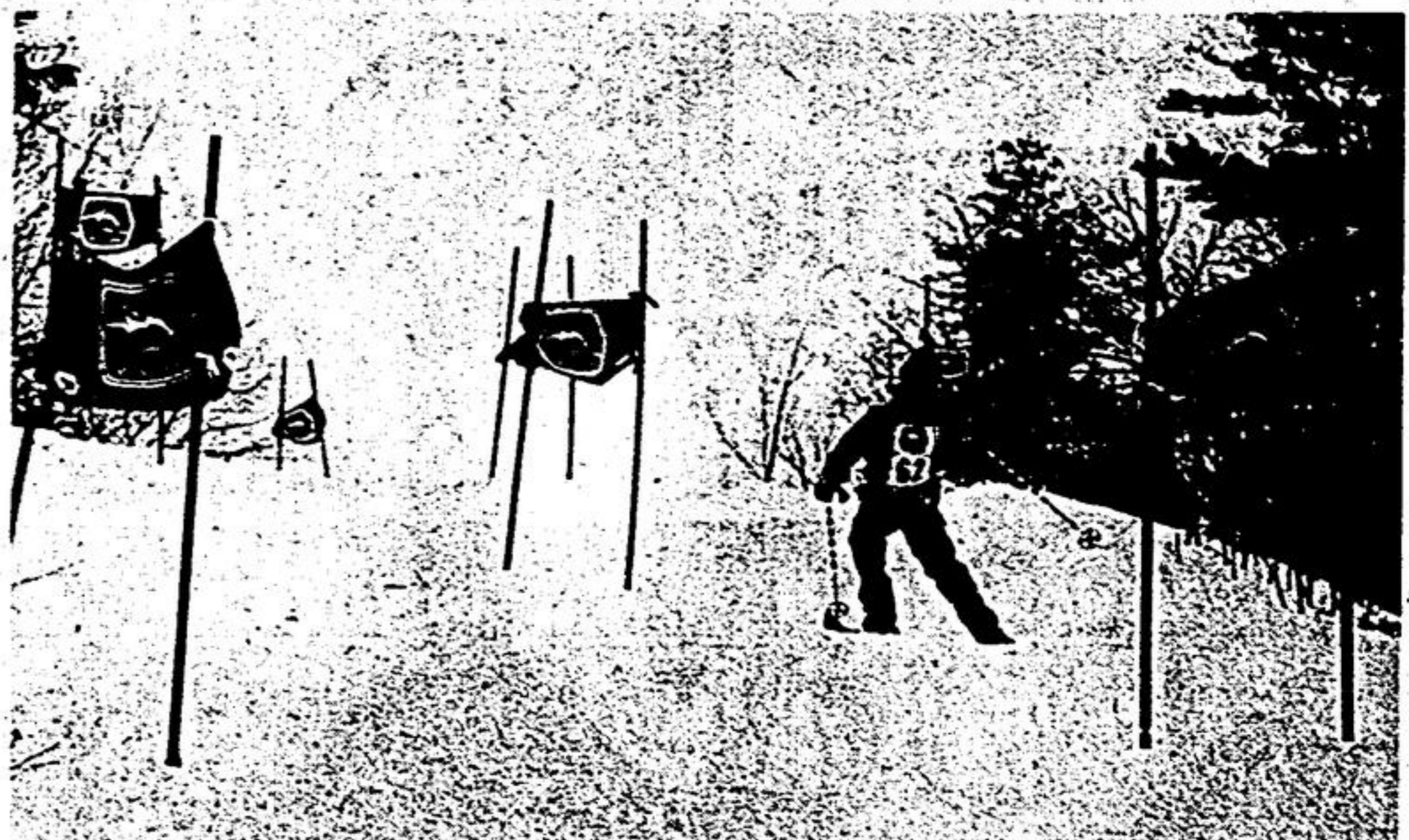
Stouffville goalie Wayne Stevens played a great game to earn his shut out.

## Snow and wind closes arena

UXBRIDGE — For the second time in the past two weeks, the old Uxbridge Arena has been forced to close for a short period.

The latest incident

happened last Thursday during the winter blizzard. The arena has to be closed when the wind velocity exceeds 56 Km ph (35 mph). Arena manager Roy Cordingley said wind gusts reached 105 Km/ph (75 mph), so the arena closed for the day. However, operations were back to normal on Friday and there was no structural damage, according to Mr. Cordingley.

The first incident was a little more serious. It occurred on Saturday, Jan. 21 as the heavy snow load, combined with thick ice, closed the building and resulted in some damage to four purline plates.

The plates rest on top of the trusses and support and carry the load between the trusses.

The arena was officially closed at 11 a.m. by engineer Dennis Bryan on the Saturday. Mr. Cordingley noticed the condition on the north side of the arena and informed the arena board of the situation.

Assistance was called in to remove the snow, compounded by the ice formed on the top. The blowing snow had also caused considerable drifting in several places.

Following the snow removal, the arena was re-opened on the Monday, and a hoist from Oshawa was brought in to repair the damaged plates.

The closure resulted in the cancellation of the night's Intermediate D league in Uxbridge. The Claremont Corner Lunch recently withdrew from the league due to lack of players. It is hoped the scheduling will be returned to normal for this weekend's games.
