Crests will be given to anyone that completes the 10 hours and also trophies will be awarded for the youngest skaters and for those with the most pledges.

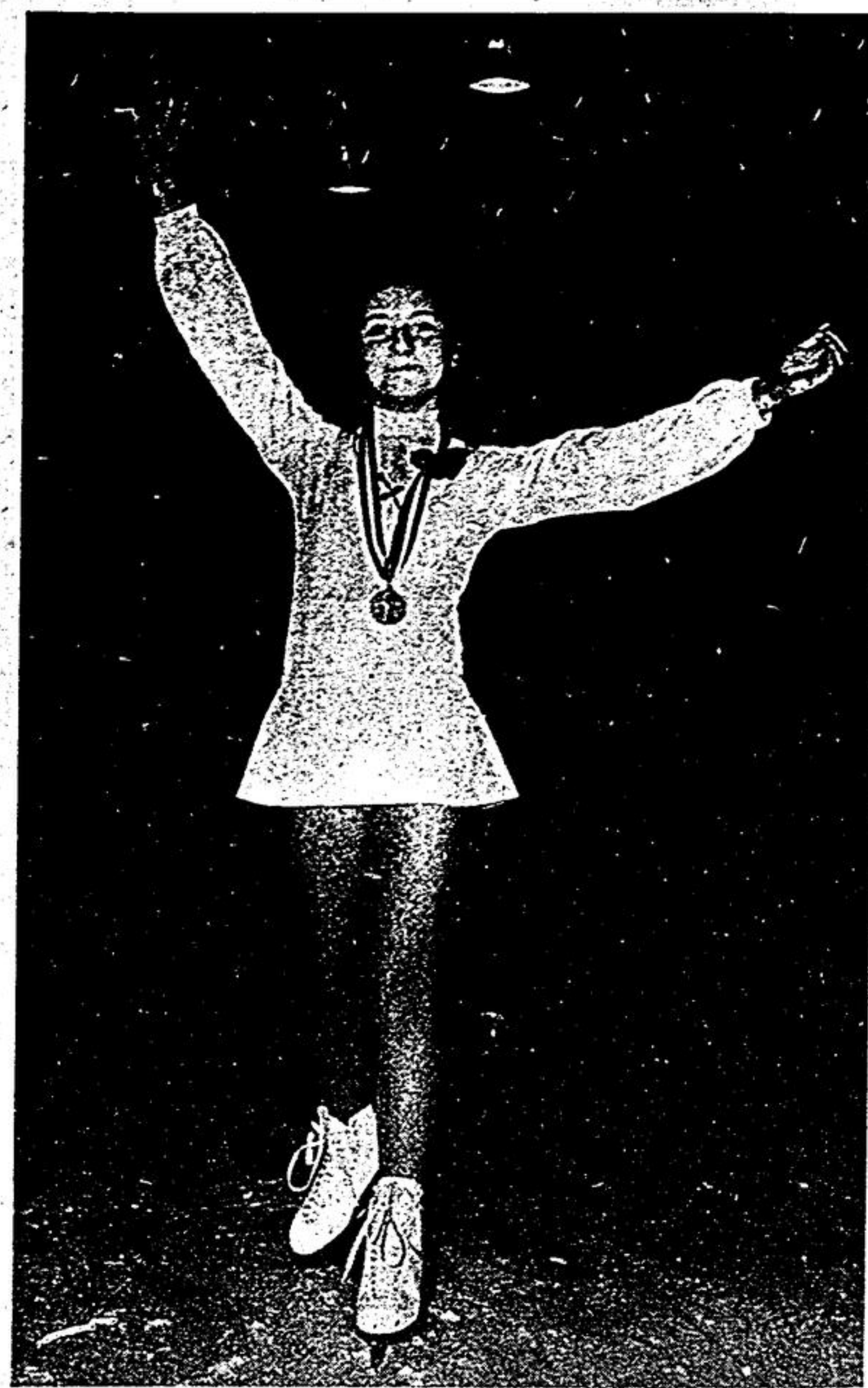
Pop and sandwiches will be supplied for the skaters at lunch hour.

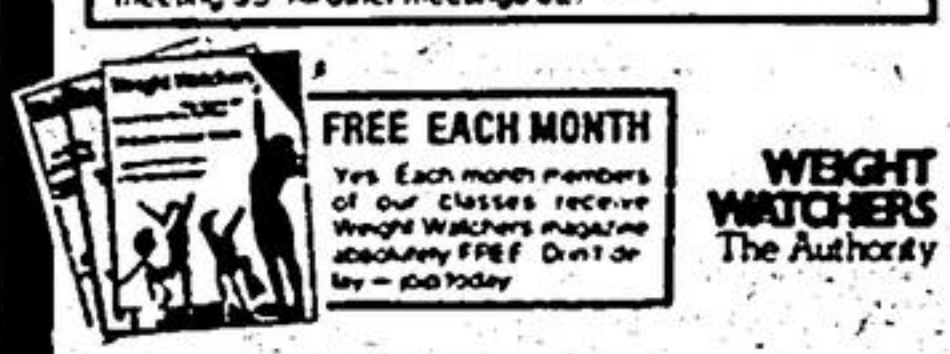

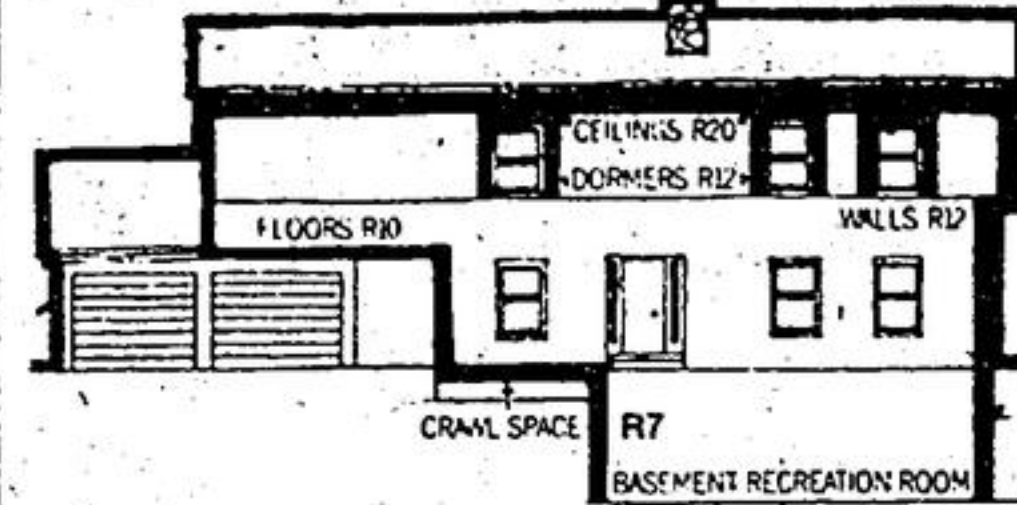
