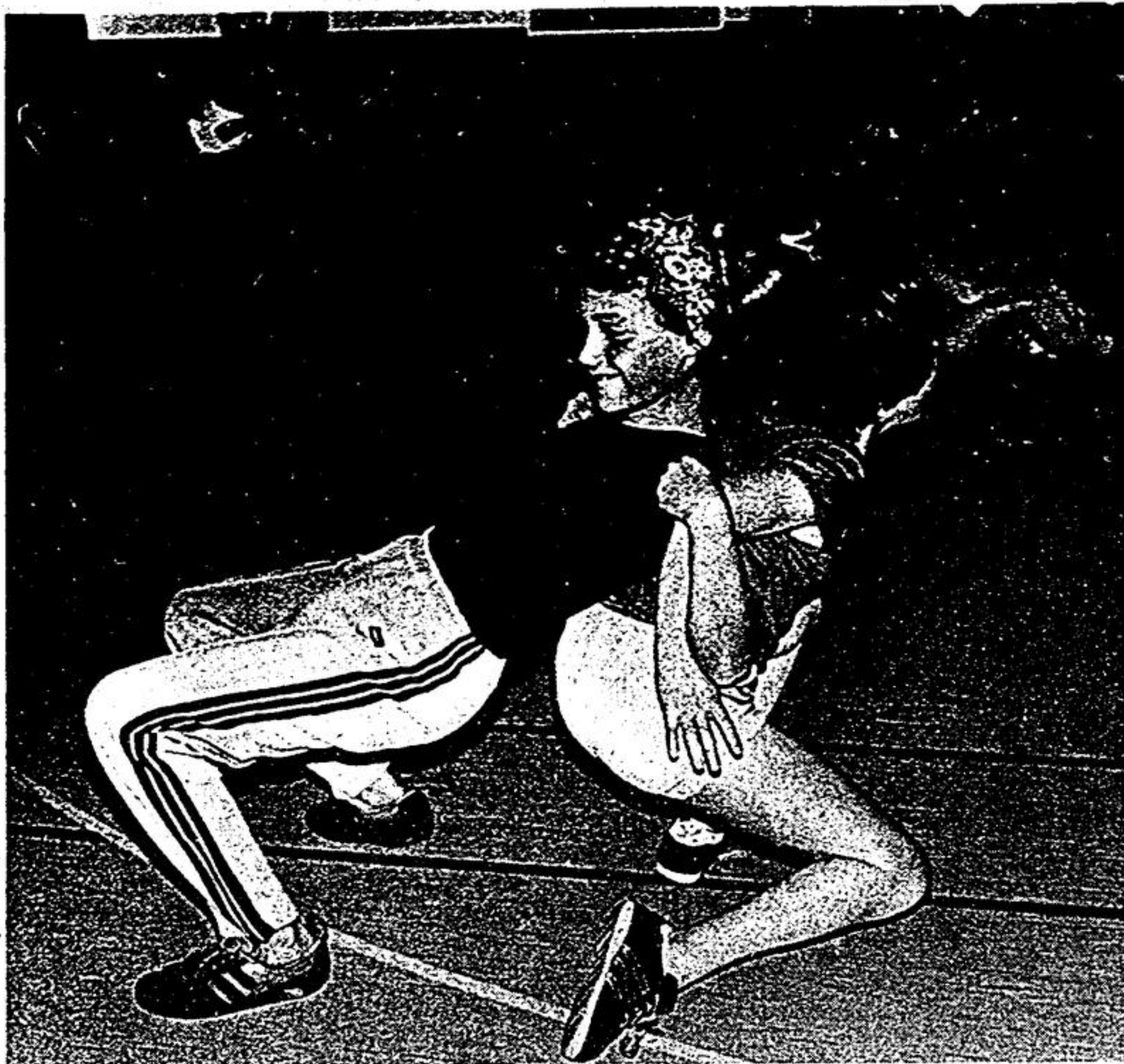
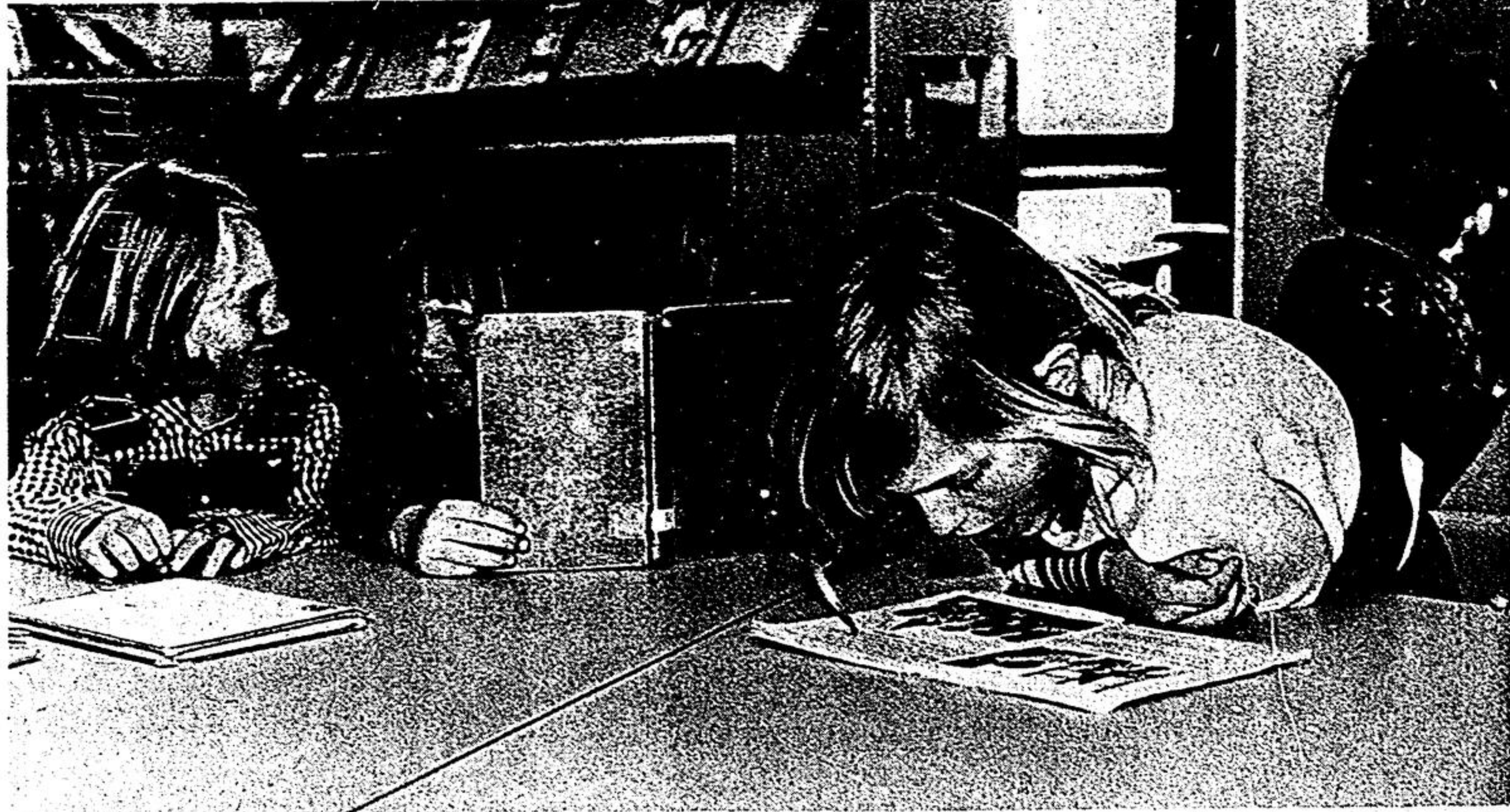


# Summitview pupils enjoy new gym, library
