front, down, back, and then ears. Always roll to front and then to back each time.

ARM ROLLS - stretch arms straight out to sides at shoulder level, palms facing up, elbow bend facing down, thumbs toward back. Turn or roll the arms and hands 360 degrees to the front until hands are in the same position

and the elbow bend is facing up. SPINE ROLLS - stand tall with feet about 1 foot (30 cm) apart. Drop head to chest. Keep legs straight or slightly bent and hips stationary. Roll spine down one vertebra at a time, gently, like a roll top desk, until you are bent over and looking at your knees, let head and arms hang loose. Gently roll up allowing one vertebra at a time to come into place starting at the base of the spine.

These Yoga Rolls are designed to stretch and relax the muscles of the back, shoulders, arms, neck, and head. In doing so fresh blood is allowed to circulate to these areas and washes away stale blood and tension. It is imperative to take a deep breath after each Roll. Fill the entire lungs by allowing the lower rib cage to expand when you inhale and allowing it to contract when you exhale. Oxygen is very important for relaxation, and is, in fact, a necessity for relaxation.

You are in charge of your body, you have allowed it to become tight or tense and you should be the one who relaxes and relieves it. Don't be afraid to get help, but do be afraid to let someone or something else do the work for you. When you learn how to handle stress and tension and how to relax, you will be on your way to living happily and healthfully, naturally.
