Taxi driver feared for life during cab hi-jacking

NEWMARKET - It was the second day of spring and 67-year-old cabbie Sam Gilbert of Toronto was telling everyone "it's good to be alive."
Sam should know, he thought he was facing death early last week when he looked along the muzzle of a sawed-off .22 rifle into the hard cold eyes of an eighteen year old youth, and thought "this is it."
Sam had picked up a youth and his girl companion near Finch Ave. on Monday night and they had asked him to drive them a few miles north. The pale quiet girl sat with a dog in her lap as the taxi drove northwards and Sam said he had no reason whatever to be suspicious.
He did get a little worried however when the youth in the back of the taxi kept telling him that his destination was "just a few miles further." It crossed Sam's mind that he might not get paid in full for so long a trip.
Sam knew something was wrong however when he was ordered to stop his cab in an isolated area of Whitchurch - Stouffville. He was ordered out of the cab at gun point and told to "start walking."
"It was the worst ordeal of my life" Sam Gilbert told The Tribune as he sat in Newmarket Court last week awaiting the brief appearance of the two persons charged with armed robbery, and other offences.
The 67-year-old man said that he tried reasoning with his gun toting passenger and promised "I won't say a word about this." Sam said he told the youth "Do me a favour, this ride is on the house," he said the answer to his plea, was a gun poked into his back and an order to "get going."
The thoughts that went through Sam Gilbert's mind after that weren't the pleasantest. "I kept thinking he was going to shoot, a person could have been killed out in that spot and have been there for weeks without being found."
The next thing he heard however was the screech of tires as his cab was driven away and he was left alone in the dark and cold of the night.
"Sam looked so legit" Sam commented to Detective Sgt. William Gervais who is in charge of police investigation in the matter. He added "I'm always careful about who I pick up and they told me they only wanted to go a few miles."
The elderly taxi driver, completely lost, wandered along the dark and unfamiliar road without knowing which direction he was heading

Regional Police and in particular Sgt. Gervais who he said "did everything they could for me."
Police located Sam's car which had been abandoned on the ice of Lake Simcoe, its transmission shot. It cost Sam \$65 to get the vehicle towed off the ice and it will cost him another \$300 or so to get the cab fixed, but Sam had the last laugh, his assailants did not find the \$40 or so in cash which he had put away in a hidden pocket in the car.
"Hello could have been trigger happy, I could be dead now" Sam told The Tribune as he was taken upstairs into court by Sgt. Gervais.
His parting words, "There'll be no teenagers in my cab ever again after midnight, and no more out of town rides." Sam was content to
