

Bears pick up two silver medals

The Neil Patrick Polar Bears finished off the season by competing in two tournaments, and came away silver medalists both times.

In the AMOS tournament in Cobourg, along with the silver medallions which each player received, awards were presented for the most outstanding players and Stouffville brought home three awards.

Captain Tim Evans won the most valuable player award along with the award for the most assists. Goalie Bruce Fifield brought home the top goalie trophy for his outstanding net-minding.

Goalie Bruce Fifield made several good stops thus keeping the 1-1 tie.
