Metro approves conservation cost

TORONTO — A general operating budget of \$5,864,000 and a capital budget of \$5,846,000 for 1978 has been approved by the 51-member Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority.

The authority has developed programs designed to further the conservation, restoration, development and management of the natural resources of the 1,339 square miles included in the authority's area of jurisdiction.

In accordance with the policy, adopted by the authority in 1976, the 1978 budget was again developed with emphasis on erosion control and flood control programs.

The 1978 capital budget estimates include \$2,400,000 for the second year of the second phase of the waterfront development plan. The total cost of this second phase anticipates a total expenditure of \$22 million, which will be financed by a 50 per cent grant from the province of Ontario and 50 per cent from the authority's member municipalities comprised of The Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto, The Regional Municipalities of Durham, Peel and York and the Townships of Adjara and Mono.

The capital budget also includes \$3,446,000 for development and land acquisitions in the authority's flood and erosion control and bank stabilization programs.

Grants from the province of Ontario, through The Ministry of Natural Resources, for both the current and capital programs of the authority, total \$4,326,200, of which \$603,000 is towards the cost of administration, \$2,290,200 for water and related land management development programs, \$233,000 for conservation and recreation land management, and \$1,200,000 towards the 1978 waterfront program.

Total contributions from the authority's member municipalities for current and capital programs, including the Waterfront Plan, will total \$4,969,100 in 1978.

Revenues from operations of conservation areas, conservation education and Black Creek Pioneer Village are anticipated to be approximately \$2 million in 1978.

The authority is indebted to The Ministry of Culture and Recreation for an annual operating grant for Black Creek Pioneer Village and the Kortright Centre.
