For many older folk home is where their RV stops for the night - or, more often, where it parks for longer periods.

RVs (recreational vehicles) include a range of living accommodation running from a simple tent on wheels to luxury motor homes costing as much as a small bungalow.

With warm-weather

days ahead it's appropriate to consider this type of housing in our shelter-for-seniors series. Of course, a good many older folks live in RVs the year round, moving north or south as temperatures dictate.

Close to a million Canadian families own some kind of RV. Many of these homes on wheels are towed or driven by

seniors and many more will be checking dealer lots about now.

Right now is not the best time to get a bargain, with younger folk eager to take to the road and dealers not hungry for sales - as they will be in off-peak seasons.

But, because sales lots are full of the latest offerings, it is a good time

for you to look and assess what is being offered and to decide (1) whether RV travel and living is the life for you and (2) what sort of RV best suits your purse, personality and physical condition.

Canvas only the lots of well-established, reputable dealers. Ask friends and people you meet about their RV preferences and purchases.

Even if you are considering only a modest tent trailer, pass up general merchandise stores, discount outlets or car dealers who only handle RVs as a summer sideline.

Give preference to RVs bearing a CSA (Canadian Standards Association) certificate and the CRVA seal of approval of the Canadian Recreational Vehicle Association.

Trailers towed behind your car require considerable skill to drive safely and a fair amount of work when you set up at camp site or trailer park. Also your car must be of sufficient size and power to pull the load properly and safely. So as a general comment (which may not apply to your particular case) I suggest a small truck camper or motor home for older travellers.

If you book ahead you should be able to rent a small motor home for a spin or two before fall. See how you like the life.

Then when those slow months come for dealers (January, February, March) make him an offer on the RV you have selected - if, and only if, you are fully persuaded that this is the life for you.

## Recyclers support town

Dear Sir:

Several weeks ago it was reported that the Recycling Depot was planning to turn back to the citizens of Stouffville the money which has been realized from materials collected. As a follow-up to this we'd like to advise that the following projects have been undertaken so far:

1. Free ice time at the arena on March 27 - \$30.
2. Sponsoring a team for the Whitchurch-Stouffville Soccer Club - \$100.
3. A donation to the town for new tennis nets - \$250.
4. Uniforms for the Novice girls' all-star baseball team - \$350. (This covers three years.)

Whereas this year the emphasis has been on sports, it is intended in the future that other worthwhile endeavours will be supported.

For our customers, we now have available at the depot, stickers which can be put either on a car or in a window at home. They show the Whitchurch-Stouffville Recycling Depot logo with words "Please do as we do - recycle". There is no charge for the stickers.

As a result of the increased use of the depot by local businesses, we have had to

expand our place - and this has been made possible by the Town allowing us to use another bay in the building. Increased business naturally leads to increased work, and we are VERY MUCH IN NEED OF MORE VOLUNTEERS, particularly during the summer months. All that is required is 1 1/2 to two hours a month on either Thursday or Saturday. We are confident that in a town the size of Stouffville there are many people who could spare this small amount of time. If you can help us, please phone Jean Belisle 640-4870.

We have been experiencing some problems lately in connection with the scrap metal bin which is outside at the south end of the depot - (a) people throwing garbage into the bin, when the large "town" garbage bin is full; and (b) people removing material from the bin and scattering it around the area.

This Recycling Depot bin is for the deposit of scrap metal only.
