

THE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AND HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT ACT  
ROAD CLOSING

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Ontario Municipal Board has approved the closing of certain roads intersecting the controlled-access Highway No. 404, in the Towns of Richmond Hill and Whitchurch-Stouffville, Regional Municipality of York, as a result of an application by the Minister of Transportation and Communications at a Public Hearing on January 18, 1978 at Toronto.

Claims for compensation for injurious affection with particulars of the claim shall be made within one year after the physical closing of the road and if not so made, the right to said compensation will be forever barred in accordance with Section 22 of The Expropriations Act.
