Mike Lafleur was the scoring hero as he fought his way to two tries (four points each). Steve Schell had one convert to complete the scoring. Hooker Kevin Hamilton and props Tom Lehman and Larry Holt played outstanding also.

The following day marked a visit to Stouffville by the Oakwood Barons from Toronto, the team that beat the Spartans 13-0 at last year's All-Ontario tournament. This time however

the decision was reversed as the Spartans came away with a 10-4 win. Those who saw the game felt it was the best played match of rugby at SDSS this year.

Again, it was Mike Lafleur playing a large role in the scoring as he put down the second try for Stouffville to give them a 10 point lead after Schell's conversion. Tony Arrigo had scored the first try on a very pretty passing play with Angelo Monopoli. The loss was only Oakwood's second of

this season. The third game was a league affair, and the Spartans walked off with a 15-0 victory over King City, in a rough game. Mike Boadway led the team with two tries and Steve Schell added seven points on two converts and a penalty kick.

signed up, easily fulfilling their goal of four teams. In fact, even with 14 players on each team there are still a few girls that had to be put on reserves.

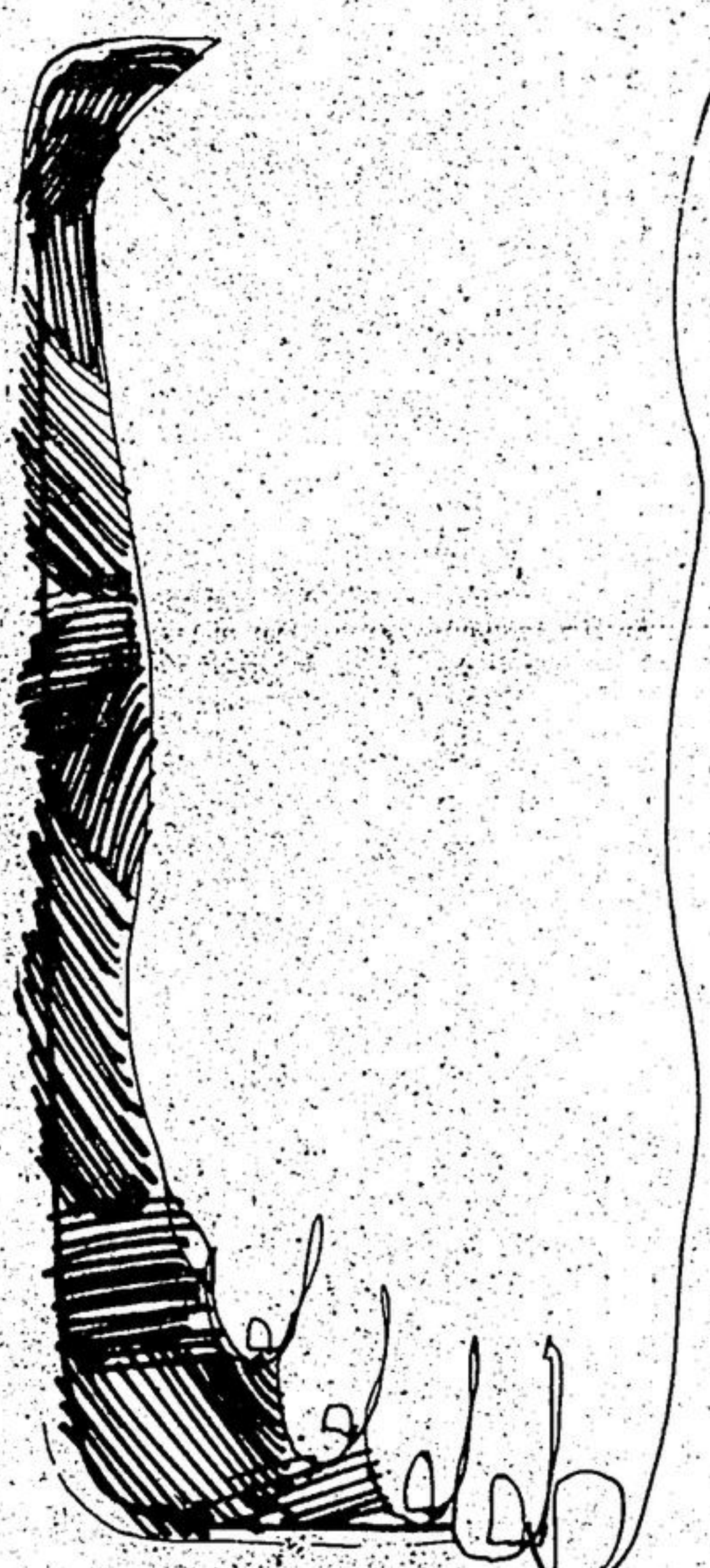
It is expected that some girls might drop out during the season, so the reserves were told not to give up hope. Last Tuesday was the league's first games.

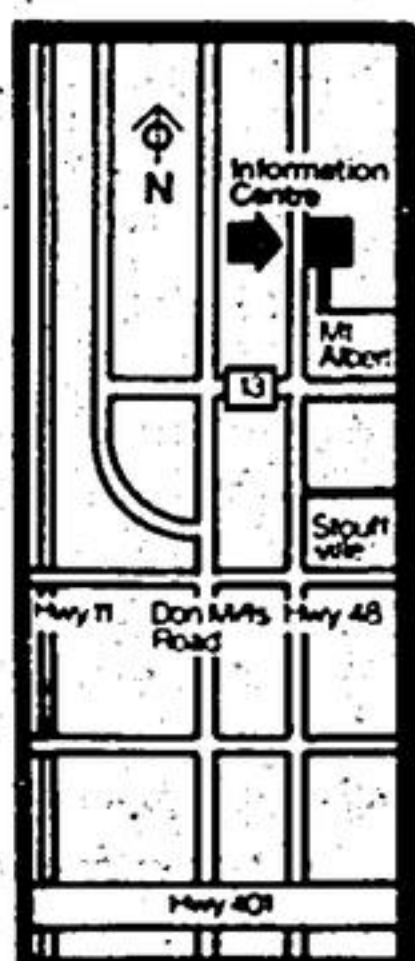
