Check butter fraud

When you dine out, the butter on your roll may not be butter — it could be margarine or even lard, according to the York Regional Health Unit.

At least one individual is distributing or selling an unlabelled product as butter to local restaurants and other food premises. While this product has the same general appearance as butter the unit warns that often such a product is instead either margarine or lard. Some of this confiscated products is currently being analysed at a laboratory to establish its exact identity and to prove whether or not it is fit for human consumption.

Under the Oleomargarine Act, "every package containing oleomargarine shall have legibly marked thereon: (a) the word oleomargarine or the trade name of the contents; (b) a list of the ingredients in the oleomargarine and the percent of each ingredient.

Under the Public Health Act, it is an offence to distribute any food to the public that is unfit for human consumption.

The health unit says it received information that the product in question is being distributed in a brown pick-up truck (with wooden canopy and red Ontario licence plates) and this particular operator may also be venturing into Durham Region and Simcoe County.

Evidence to date indicates that this product is being distributed in an illegal manner; further, it has not yet proved safe for public consumption. If anyone should have further information concerning this matter they should contact the York Regional Health Unit (895-4511) or the York Regional Police (895-1221).
