The Friendship club will meet Thursday evening in the Legion Hall, Time 6:30 p.m. All senior citizens welcome those wishing a ride call 640-2443.

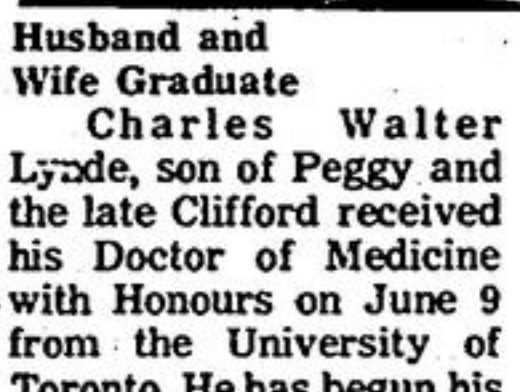

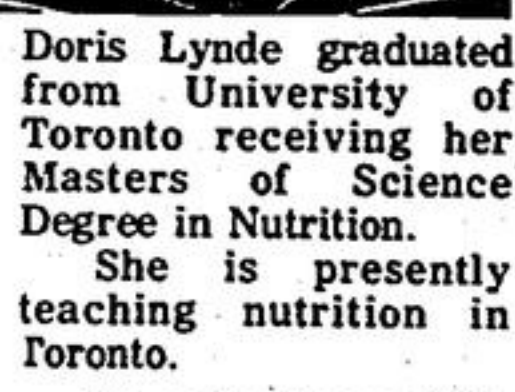

United Church Women from Goodwood attended the Pine Grove Ladies Auxiliary on Wednesday June 7. Gladys Lehman was the

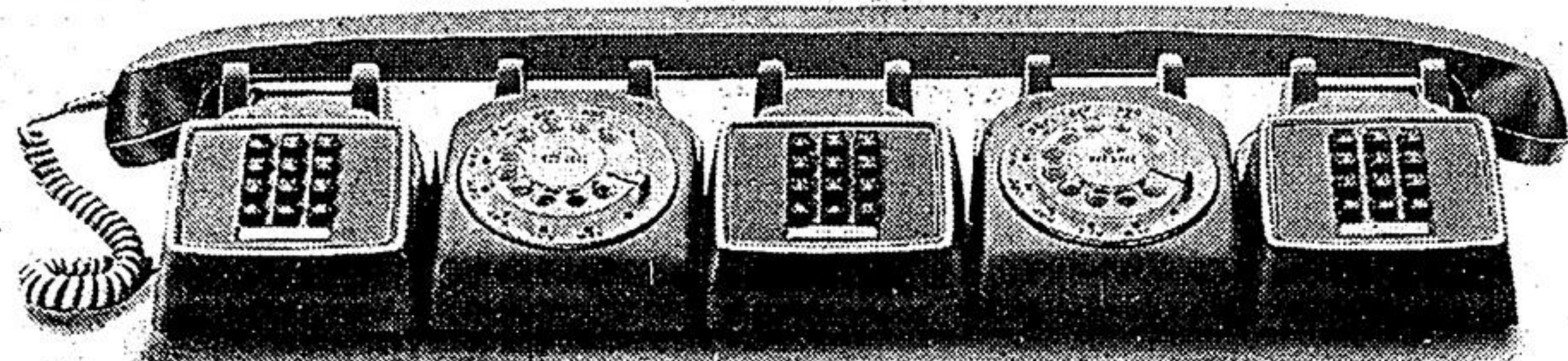
guest speaker and spoke on conditions in Israel. Mrs. Lehman had visited her daughter who is living in Israel. The ladies reported a very interesting meeting.
