From now on, immigrants and those visitors who come here to work or study must make all immigration arrangements before arriving in Canada. No one may change his or her status while inside Canada.

Remember that money can't buy your way into Canada. All the help you need is free at any Canadian Government visa office or Canada Immigration Centre.

Canadian immigration officers do not discriminate on the grounds of colour, race or religion. Ever.

A new adjudication system gives greater protection to the civil rights of people involved in immigration proceedings. And deportation will no longer be the only possible penalty. There are now less drastic alternatives for minor infractions of immigration law. The new law does not make immigration easier, but it does make it more predictable. If you need to know more, ask at a Canada Immigration Centre.

If you know someone abroad who needs information, tell them to contact their Canadian Government visa office before they make a move. That way, they'll know exactly where they stand when they step off the plane.
