# Juveniles take easy win over Amesbury

The Stouffville Juveniles softball team came out with a win and a tie in their two games last week.

The first game, played last Thursday, saw Stouffville fight back in the eighth inning to tie the Bramalea 2-2. Steve Spang got both runs for Stouffville, the second one coming when he stole home base in the eighth.

Dave Dart and Jim Chilvers handled the pitching duties in the game, getting eight strike-outs between them. Steve Schell provided the hitting power in the

game, swating out three singles. Last Monday night the Juveniles went up against Amesbury, and the superb pitching of Jim Chilvers combined

with the grand slam home run by Mark Fockler led Stouffville to a convincing 7-3 victory.

Jim displayed the brilliance on the mound he's noted for, striking out 18 batters and allowing just two hits. Jim also had a productive offensive game, going 4/4 at the plate.

The game, however, was won by shortstop Mark Fockler's grand slam in the fifth inning. With two men out and a count of two strikes on him, Mark belted out his grand slam. A further home run was knocked out by Chris Jackson and Mike Lafleur had a

standout game on the bases, stealing easily whenever he got on. The score was not indicative of the Stouffville domination, as the last two Amesbury runs were scored on passed balls.

Player of the week is Mark Fockler, and with the win and tie, the Juveniles have compiled

a six wins, one loss and one tie record. The next game for the team is the biggest one so far this year, as Stouffville goes up against North Bendale, whom they are currently embroiled in a neck and neck race for first place in the league. This is the first time this year North Bendale has played in town, and the game gets underway at 8:30 p.m. A large crowd is hoped for in what should be a very exciting match.
