## Main St. businesses merge

After 22 years in the same location, one of Main Streets more permanent fixtures has finally moved.

Greenwood Electronics has closed its doors and its proprietor, Len Greenwood, has amalgamated with Ron Meyers of Stouffville Sound and Music, another long time and familiar resident.

The two men had been holding discussions for some time and both are pleased that the final

arrangements have been made.

Both felt that they would now be able to provide better service to their many customers now that they were located under one roof.

Greenwood Electronics was first founded by Len's uncle, Ross, who operated the business alone for about five years. Len then joined the business, which at that time carried such familiar brand names as General Electric, RCA and Telefunken.

Later, as the electronics business changed, Len became the official outlet for the Radio Shack chain and specialized in Telefunken and Quasar equipment.

Len has been the sole operator for the last eight years, since his uncle left the business.

He joined forces with Ron Meyers, who has been in his present location on the corner of Mill and Main Streets for the last eight years and carries a wide variety of

brand name stereos, televisions and assorted paraphernalia. Stouffville Sound and Music offers guitar lessons, sheet music, and records.

The partnership between the two men means all those stereo and television needs, including repairs, are easily found in the one location.

Len echoed Ron's remark "We're bigger now and we hope, that much better."

## Hamlet of Vandorf misplaced

VANDORF — The wheels of bureaucracy grind slowly in the small hamlet of Vandorf, and in one instance, have stopped completely a few lots north of where they should have.

Dr. Peter Van Nostrand is a Vandorf resident who has managed to keep track of the rapidly moving events since 1972, at which time the township of Whitchurch was going through the amalgamation process with the former village of Stouffville and changes were being made in the zoning bylaws.

Dr. Van Nostrand owns a farm on the east side of Woodbine Avenue, just south of a garage owned by his brother George. The garage was supposed to be zoned commercial.

But it didn't happen that way.

The doctor ended up with a 200 foot square block of land in the middle of his farm zoned commercial. The garage was still zoned rural.

The Van Nostrands complained, but no action was taken at the time. Later, the garage was

rezoned commercial, but the doctor still had his own little piece of commercial property smack in the middle of his farm.

So, the doctor went commercial. He began selling vegetables, turkeys, beef and other farm produce from this site.

Suddenly, this year, it appeared that he was going to get the rezoning he wanted those six years ago. Other hamlet residents were requesting rezonings and planning board was considering rezoning the Van Nostrand property at the same time.

He came to council and told them that although six years ago he wanted his farm zoned rural, he now likes having his little piece of highway commercial property. Council agreed to allow the zoning to remain as it is so as not to inconvenience the doctor. Planning Board

Chairman, Eldred King suggested that the problem arose out of a possible mapping error in 1972.

## Increased parking

STOUFFVILLE — The piece of property immediately south of the Bank of Commerce parking lot on Market Street has been levelled and gravelled for the use of downtown shoppers in search of parking.

The property has been rented by the town from the Bank of Commerce for the nominal sum of \$1 per year with the town assuming the cost of upkeep.
