# Schools get new principals

There will be three new faces at the Orchard Park, Ballantrae and Whitchurch - Highlands public schools this September.

The faces won't be those of kindergarten kids, but those of a more advanced age, new principals.

Each principal will be bringing their own unique style to the schools.

At Ballantrae, John Laughlin takes over from Lorne Payne, who moves on to Holland Landing. John, whose been in the education system as a

principal, for 13 years plans to give Ballantrae a more athletic flavour.

In his school career John has always had an athletic influence, five years head of physical and health education in Nobleton, phys. ed. and English teacher at King.

"I'll be doing a lot of coaching, to get to know the kids better. I'm looking to get involved with the kids through physical education."

Other than that, he plans no other major changes.

"I just want to continue the high standards of the school,

emphasising the basics in reading and math."

Another emphasis he will place is by example. "I won't ask teachers to do something I wouldn't. I want to work together with them and the students."

Although John is determined to "work together", he is also an admitted believer in strong discipline, "combined with love for the kids, that's the answer. If you show the children you care, most discipline problems disappear."

He is overall, a study in the usually difficult

combination of trying to find the mid-point of encouragement and discipline, and to make both work.

"I believe in positive reinforcement," John noted, "if little Billy does good, then I'll phone up the parent and tell them."

"On the other hand I think corporal punishment has its place, as a last resort. Again what is needed is discussion with the parents, it's all a matter of teamwork with the parents and teachers, both for the good and bad."

And Mr. Laughlin is one of the "increas-

breed of principals that believes accessibility to the students is half of his job.

"My door is always open for them, that's such an important part of the job, I want the children to get to know me and I them."

## Woman charged Possession of LSD

NEWMARKET — A 31 year old former Newmarket woman told the court last week that though she is a former heroin addict, she did not know that pills she had in

her possession were L.S.D.

Kathleen Susan Bishop was charged last June 16 after R.C.M.P. and York Regional Police officers went to a Water St. home with a search warrant. A quantity of L.S.D. was found in Ms Bishop's purse.

Constable Robert Wood of the R.C.M.P. told the court they had searched the Water St. residence after receiving information that they might find L.S.D. there.

He told the court that the 31 year old woman was sitting at a table with a man and her daughter and when the pills were found in her possession claimed she was unaware of the fact they contained the illegal drug.

Ms Bishop told the court that she thought the pills contained Valium which she said she obtained from a friend because she could not afford to get a prescription for the drug.

The former Newmarket woman told the court she had taken L.S.D. at the age of 14 and "didn't like it." She confessed that she had been a heroin addict

and had served time in the States when caught trying to get \$150,000 worth of heroin over the border.

Ms Bishop told the court that she had kicked the habit and is now preaching abstinence to school groups.

Jeff Bilton, a friend, admitted giving her the pills which he claimed were Valium, he told the court they were left at his home during a party. He admitted that he uses Valium himself on occasion.

The Crown presented a certificate of analysis to the court showing evidence that the pills found on Ms Bishop were L.S.D.

"The court does not accept the evidence of the witnesses and the accused, and in any event she knowingly acknowledged she had acquired the pills contrary to the law.

Defence counsel for the 31 year old woman pleaded that his client is unemployed and is unable to pay fines. Crown counsel however said that a serious drug was involved and that a discharge would be inappropriate.
