Crown counsel Bruce Shilton told how the accused had suffered such serious injuries he almost died. Surgery was required to repair numerous fractures, a punctured liver, a crushed chest and other damage, he said.

Evidence revealed that Hale turned out to pass a slow-moving snowplow and could not return to the proper lane in time. He collided with another vehicle.

"You seem to be a man in a hurry," commented Judge McMahon after checking the accused's driving record.

Harvester has already experienced some of the industry's

Kelly points out after all this, the show requires considerable planning and is physically exhausting.

After all this, they still feel it's worthwhile. Russ and Kelly agreed the excitement of being "centre stage," all eyes on them is reward enough for now.

In the meantime, they're quite optimistic they're bound for success. After all, they did come in second in The Battle of the Bands, an amateur contest held recently at Yorkfest.

The group Rush, now international recording artists, came in third in the same competition.

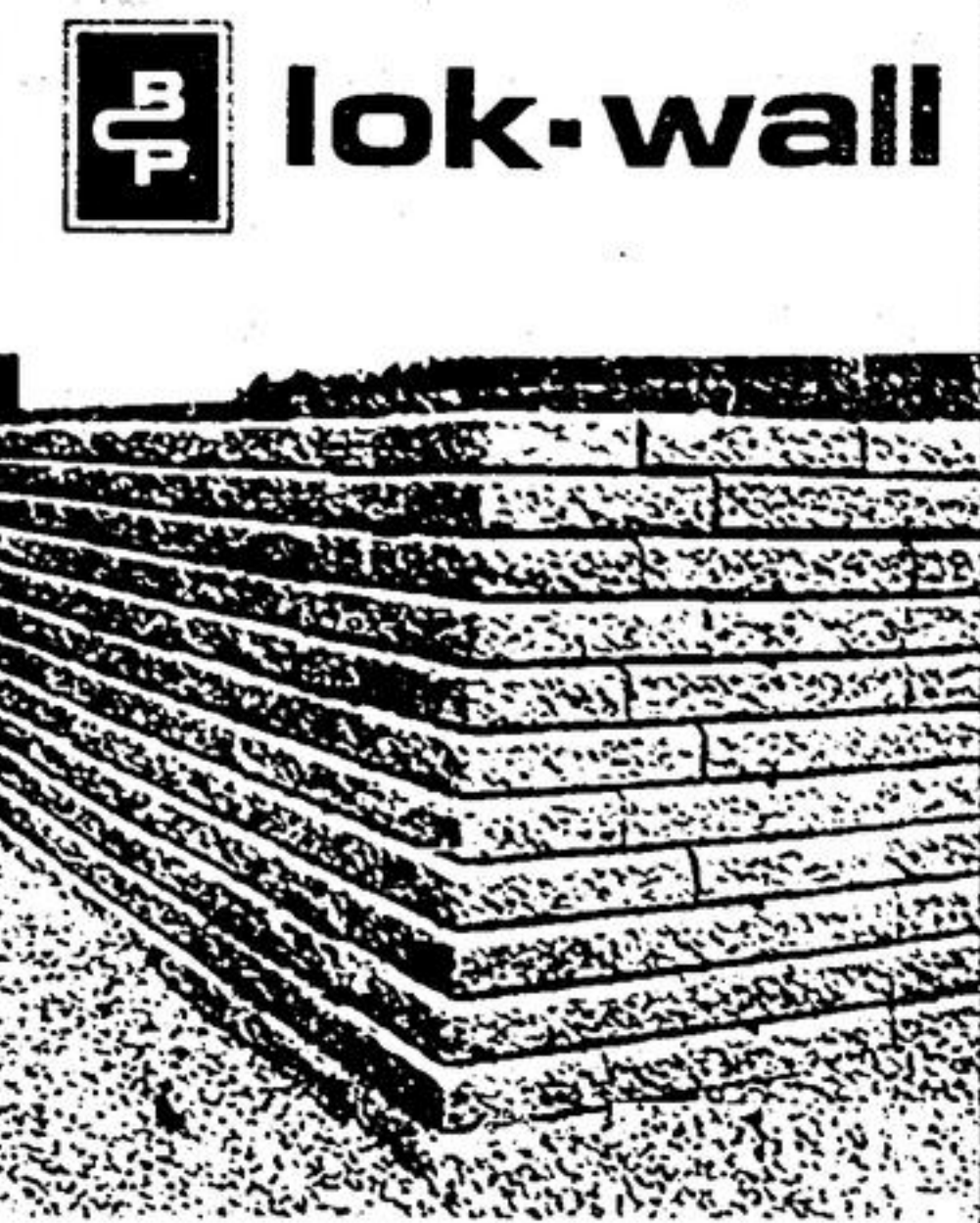
**Dismiss charge**
